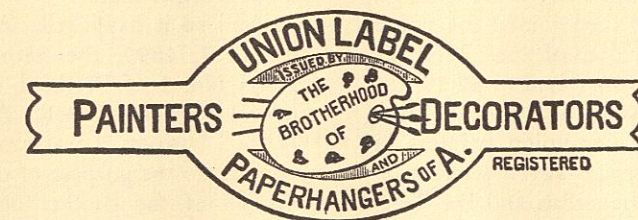

THE FOUNDING OF LOCAL 10



ON SUNDAY, February 26, 1899, a group of painters and paperhangers of Portland, 44 in number, met at the Redmen's Hall to organize into a union. They called their new organization, "The Painters, Paperhangers and Decorators Union No. 1 of Portland." It was not affiliated with the International Brotherhood of Painters. It was entirely a local venture.

At the meeting a series of resolutions were approved, calling for a nine-hour work day, an increase in wages from 25c to 30c per hour, overtime on Sunday and beyond the nine-hour day at the rate of time and one-half, regulations of numbers of apprentices to journeymen (which, curiously enough, was the same as in our present agreement) and the forming of a committee to present the resolutions for the approval of the employers.

After some weeks of negotiations the employers agreed to all of these requests, except the wage scale. They would not consent to more than \$2.50 for a nine-hour day. The union finally voted to accept the offer. By this time the union had 145 charter members, many of whom were contractors, and 34 of the employers had signed the letter, which in those days was the only formal agreement the union had with its employers.

The charter was held open for three months. During that time over 170 men joined the union at a fee of 25c and monthly dues of 25c. After the charter was closed the fee was raised to \$2.50 and the dues to 50c a month. Work was plentiful that summer. There were many non-union painters in the city and the union inserted advertisements in the two newspapers, the Oregonian and the Telegram, inviting all painters to attend their meetings.

At this time Union No. 1 affiliated with the "Trades Council"—the forerunner of our present Central Labor Council. The Trades Council was of considerable assistance to the union and succeeded in signing up the two most anti-union shops in the city, Henry Berger and Pearson's. The Trades Council was considering the question of joining the American Federation of Labor. In order to do so, its member unions had to join the proper Internationals. This question was hotly debated during the ensuing months in Union No. 1 and at one time the union voted against the idea. However, the issue was kept alive by the delegates to the Trades Council, particularly Lot Belden and finally the union instructed its secretary to write to

the Brotherhood for information. Meanwhile the union voted to accept travelling members of the Brotherhood for membership.

During the formative months of the union, emphasis was placed on social activities. Smokers were held monthly. Dances and entertainments were held, the proceeds going to hospitalized members and to the widow of one of the deceased members. (The present Death Benefit Plan makes such activities superfluous today.) In the big parade of July 4th, 1899, the members marched in formation with a huge banner, and a float advertising the union. They were dressed in clean overalls and jumpers. On Labor Day another parade was held. In those days Labor Day was not so much a holiday as it was a day to display the full strength of all the unions to the city by means of the great Labor Day Parade.

By October, 1899, the negotiations with the Brotherhood had reached the point where all difficulties were cleared away. On October 17th the union voted to hold a smoker on the 31st of the month, inviting all painters of the city, union and non-union, to attend, and at the meeting of November 7, 1899, to dissolve Union No. 1 and immediately thereafter organize into Local Union 10 of the Brotherhood.

And so it happened. At 8:15 P. M. on November 7, 1899, the 38th and last meeting of Union No. 1 of Portland, Oregon, was called to order by President Bell. After disposing of unfinished business it was moved that Union No. 1 adjourn for the purpose of organizing Local Union No. 10 of the Brotherhood of Painters, Paperhangers and Decorators of America. The motion prevailed and immediately thereafter Local Union No. 10 was formally installed by Deputy Organizer of Oregon, J. W. Stiger. This post had been especially created by the Brotherhood for the one purpose.

Thus, was founded Local Union No. 10. A small band of 63 men, devoted to the cause of unionism, with a treasury of less than \$100.00, set out to better themselves and their families and their trade by the only logical way for workingmen, without influence or voice, to take; the formation of their own union.

The loyalty and zeal of these founders will ever be a source of inspiration to the present and future members of Local No. 10.
