As a sponsor of an Afterschool At-Risk Meal and Snack Program, Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) was eligible to apply for the Oregon Department of Education's Child Care Wellness Grant. Our successful application for this funding now allows PP&R to:

- Develop and implement a cooking and gardening curriculum as a pilot at St. Johns and University Park Community Centers
- Secure durable and consumable materials needed to support this new curriculum
- Introduce new kinds of physical activities and play into existing models
- Promote healthy lifestyles and PP&R's healthy programs to the Portland community at large through development of a public event
- Expand the cooking and gardening curriculum to programs at other PP&R community centers following successful implementation at St. Johns and University Park Community Centers.
