

ORDINANCE No. 185187

Authorize contracts with Brown and Caldwell and Murray, Smith & Associates, Inc. for professional engineering services for the Sewer System Rehabilitation Final Design 2011 Project No. E10031 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Bureau of Environmental Services (BES) owns, operates and maintains more than 2,300 miles of pipe, 96 wastewater pump stations and 2 wastewater treatment plants. Such a large system necessitates continuous programmatic evaluation, repair and improvement of facilities.
2. BES has identified a series of needs for structural rehabilitation of critical combined and sanitary sewers that are at the end of their economic life and have the highest consequence of failure. These early action needs include the rehabilitation of 458 small diameter sewers and 59 large diameter sewers.
3. The attached Agreements for Services are for the necessary work scope, costs, schedules and deliverables to provide design documents, bidding phase assistance and design support during construction for rehabilitation projects identified as part of the Sewer System Rehabilitation Final Design 2011 Project.
4. The consultant selection has been conducted in accordance with Chapter 5.68 of the Code of the City of Portland.
5. The established cost for each contract is \$2,000,000, for a total cost of \$4,000,000. The cost estimate level of confidence rating is optimal. The percentage of M/W/ESB participation for Brown and Caldwell is 30 percent of the total contract amount. The percentage of M/W/ESB participation for Murray, Smith & Associates, Inc. is 41 percent of the total contract amount. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2011-2012 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESEN000020, WBS Element E10031.D14.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute a contract with Brown and Caldwell for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$2,000,000.
- b. The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute a contract with Murray, Smith & Associates, Inc. for the purpose described in Section 1, in the amount of \$2,000,000.

- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
