ORDINANCE No. 185198

*Delegate authority to the Chief Technology Officer to execute Intergovernmental Agreements for participation in the Integrated Regional Network Enterprise (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In May, 2000 City Council passed Resolution No. 35888 which directed the Bureau of General Services Communications and Networking Division (now the Bureau of Technology Services) to implement the Integrated Regional Network Enterprise (IRNE).
- 2. The creation of the IRNE was an initiative of the Portland City Council to provide very high bandwidth, high reliability, and highly secure telecommunications and network services for the City of Portland (City).
- 3. The Bureau of Technology Services (BTS) has worked to develop the IRNE and has negotiated intergovernmental agreements with local, state and federal government agencies throughout the region for IRNE services.
- 4. Since its inception, the City has entered into 15 revenue-generating intergovernmental agreements with various government agencies to provide access to the IRNE. Yearly revenue generated by IRNE services is estimated at approximately \$2,800,000 for FY 2012-13. BTS continues to receive new requests from government agencies interested in gaining access to, or in renewing, their participation in the IRNE.
- 5. In the coming years, BTS will need to enter into, on a routine basis, numerous intergovernmental agreements for IRNE services with the various local, state, and federal agencies and institutions.
- 6. The execution of routine intergovernmental agreements and amendments to existing agreements for establishing access to, or continuing participation in, the IRNE with each agency would be more efficiently managed and involve less administrative burden if delegated to the Chief Technology Officer.

NOW THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Chief Technology Officer is authorized to approve and execute on behalf of the City, new intergovernmental agreements and amendments to existing intergovernmental agreements, with various agencies for access to the City's IRNE. Approval by the City Attorney of all intergovernmental agreements and amendments as to form shall be required prior to their execution.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay would impede the City's ability to execute revenue generating intergovernmental agreements recently requested as urgent by two local government agencies; therefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
