Parks will receive up to \$50,000 to cover the cost of garden construction. The new garden will generate revenue for Parks through annual rental fees for plots. The garden is expected to contain more than 30 plots that will rent for \$21 per year. Plot fees are evaluated yearly and raised according to cost of service studies.

a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The community will benefit from the construction of the Grant Community Garden because they will have an opportunity to grow fresh vegetables, engage in outdoor recreation, meet their neighbors, and build a strong connected community. In addition, we have already seen great demand for a community garden in this area. The closest gardens operated by the City of Portland are over 2 miles away and have on average 100 people waiting for a plot. To date 40 people have expressed interest in reserving a plot at the new Grant Community Garden.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

This project was initiated by students at Grant High School. Under the guidance of Portland Parks and Recreation's (PPR) Public Involvement Manager, the students created and implemented a public involvement plan for the project to inform neighbors and invite participation in the project. This work was conducted during the summer and fall of 2011, continued in 2012 and culminated in a Town Hall meeting in February 2012 to unveil the garden design. Land owner Portland Public Schools has been an active partner and a strong supporter since the beginning of the project.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The public was very supportive of the proposed project. That support was necessary in order to proceed with the development of the garden.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Under the guidance of PPR's Community Involvement Program Manager, the students at Grant High School created and implemented a public involvement plan for the project to inform neighbors and invite participation in the project.
