- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 184869 adopted on September 14, 2011 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Emergency Coordination Center Project. The purpose of this project is to construct a new LEED certified Gold building and the relocation of a section of SE Bush Street to house the Emergency Coordination Center.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$11,000,000.00 and the confidence level was optimal. Funds are available in WBS Element B00001.CAP.DES.
- **9.** RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept recommendation to award the contract to Emerick Construction Co. in the amount of \$10,350,000.00.
