#### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

In 2010, Dana Thomas sued the City of Portland and two of her former managers at the Portland Housing Bureau for events arising in 2008. Ms. Thomas originally asserted claims dating back to 2005, most of which were time-barred from the lawsuit. The lawsuit raised a variety of claims and allegations, including race discrimination, retaliation and Equal Protection claims under the Fourteenth Amendment. In May 2009, Ms. Thomas left her position at what was then the Bureau of Housing and Community Development (now the Housing Bureau) for a position in the Water Bureau. In November 2009, Ms. Thomas left the Water Bureau for reasons unrelated to the litigation, but she remains eligible to be recalled from a lay-off list. Her lawsuit seeks economic damages of up to \$500,000, noneconomic damages of \$200,000, plus attorney fees and court costs.

As a result of a judicial settlement conference, a tentative settlement has been reached whereby Ms. Thomas dismisses her lawsuit and forgoes the possibility of future employment with the City of Portland, in exchange for payment from the City of \$115,000. Although the City denies the lawsuit's allegations of discrimination and retaliation, Risk Management and the City Attorney's office recommend this settlement to resolve all issues in the lawsuit, dissolve the employment relationship and avoid the time and expense of trial and plaintiffs' attorney fees, which would very likely be higher than the settlement value, and risk of an adverse jury decision.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payments \$90,000 from the liability fund, \$10,000 in wages from the Housing Bureau and \$15,000 in wages from the Water Bureau, for a total of \$115,000.

#### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Dana Thomas bodily injury lawsuit in the sum of \$115,000 by ordinance on the consent agenda.
