Welcome & Review Meeting Purpose	Marc Jolin chaired this PHAC meeting. Traci reviewed the agenda and discussed new equity focus of PHB.	
PHB Equity Business Plan	Traci welcomed Bruce Watts and Hector Roche (BMW). Bruce was engaged in June 2011 to assist PHB with equity plan. Two key tactical steps: Guiding Principles and Equity Impact Analysis Tool. These tools can be used to operationalize PHB policies and programs. Bruce summarized work-to-date, including meeting with internal stakeholders and PHB partners to familiarize BMW with current process/programs. BMW has reviewed staff structure, procurement, etc. Key insights: track more qualitative data to capture work being done & establish clear equity goals; clarify role of PHB as funder (v.	✓ BMW is working to finalize the Equity Business Plan after feedback from today's PHAC meeting. Hector stressed the learning/growing nature of the Plan.

	borrower/developer/contractor); recommend business process changes; identify best methods for leveraging Procurement Office; increase community involvement and communications; develop accounting metrics; identify links to Portland Plan; set up public meetings/focus groups with partners regarding best business practices.	
	BMW's key recommendations are (1) Guiding Principles: operationalize equity plan – govern how decisions are made, how resources are allocated, how we message public, how we measure accountability. (2) Impact Analysis Tool: this will be a lens into impact of decisions, allocations, etc. Tool will help target resources.	
	Tool should be reviewed for intended and unintended results and be continually revised. PHAC/PHB may meet with Council to discuss how to adapt Tool.	
	We need to address community assumptions — engage nontraditional partners for input; engage leaders early in process; encourage organization & staff development with mentoring, job-shadowing, etc., to integrate equity plan into operations.	
	Data: we need both qualitative and quantitative data, and we should discuss other types of data to collect and respond to.	
	PHB should leverage its goodwill and leadership role. PHB needs to tie equity plan

Equity Data and Roll-Out Plan	Daniel discussed action items on the Roll-Out Plan draft. There is an urgency to get a finalized plan in place by July 1, 2012. There is a need to further discuss data and methodology of equity plan.	
	Antoinette discussed data — there are many different ways to report data and in the past much data has been driven by need for federal compliance. Going forward, PHB will implement new system to consolidate bureauwide data. New system is web-based and will help track program performance. The data is not perfect but there is a strong plan going forward. There are equity implications on data collection and usage. Data reporting forms should be looked at and changes made. This new software has been used across the nation and is very editable.	
	Marc asked whether white poverty data should be included in the data; Traci stated it was not reflected but could be considered. PHAC reviewed examples of disparity based on Coalition of Communities of Color data. Ann Curry-Stevens consulted with PHB on the data that was brought to PHAC today. Some communities are not reflected in data — PHB will work to improve this going forward.

Setting	Daniel would like to see equity goals reflected	
	in contracts starting this year. There is no	
	great model out there, so this will be a	
	learning opportunity. PHB is asking PHAC and the community to take a risk in moving	
	forward with the equity plan; there is a desire	
	to remove barriers and measure progress	
	against goals. PHB would like to close disparity	
	gaps in 1-3 years.	
	There is a need for more resource	
	development to meet disparity needs.	
	Undercount in reported data is acknowledged.	
	PHB programs provide services but don't	
	necessarily always reduce disparity equitably.

	Providing more housing is a priority, but there	
	may be a need for more economic participation	
	in PHB projects; PHB needs to find ways to

	Bruce recommended getting vendor

	Daniel asked PHAC for feedback regarding new	
	methodology; she stressed a need for bureau-	
	wide conversations. It may be difficult to start	
	equity conversations with contractors at a	
	staff level - PHB needs to strategize an	
	approach and help contractors be more	
	equitable in a sensitive manner.
