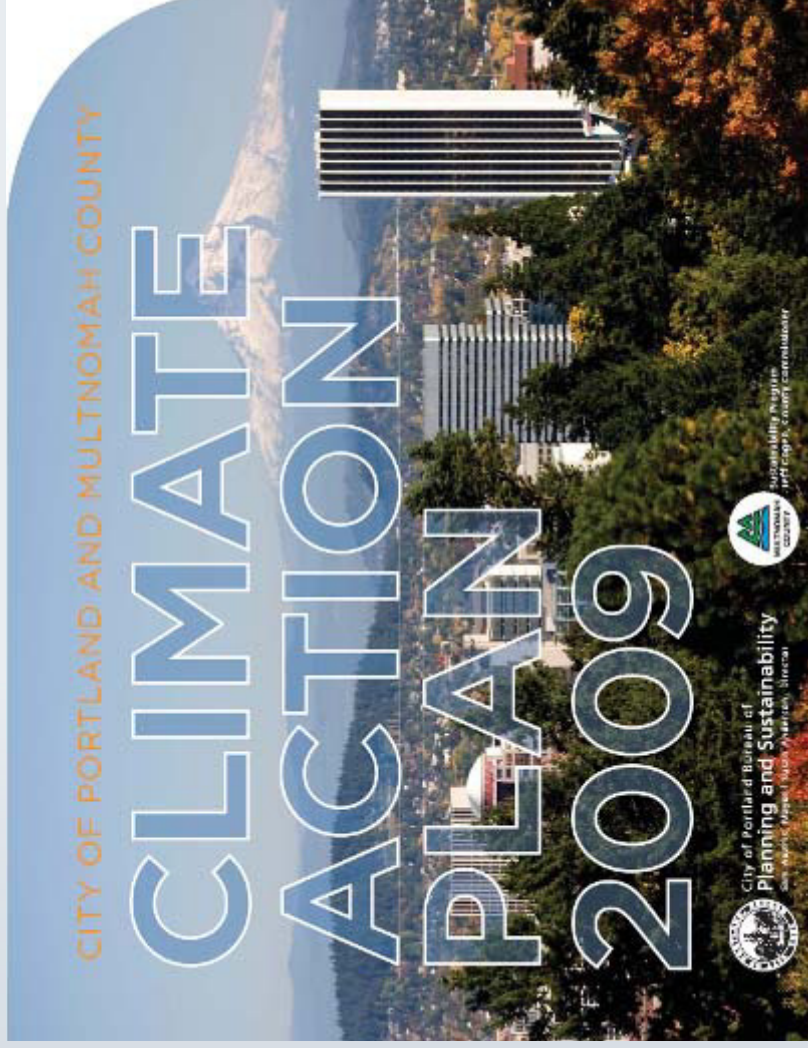

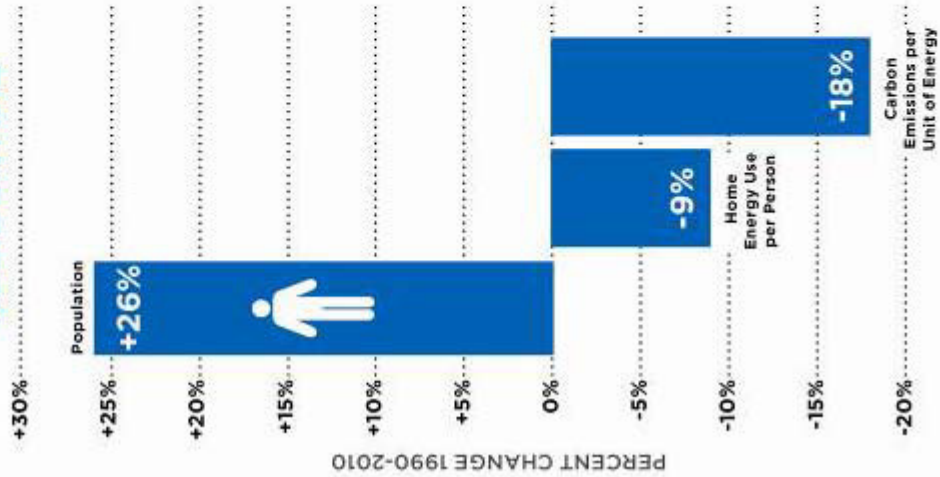

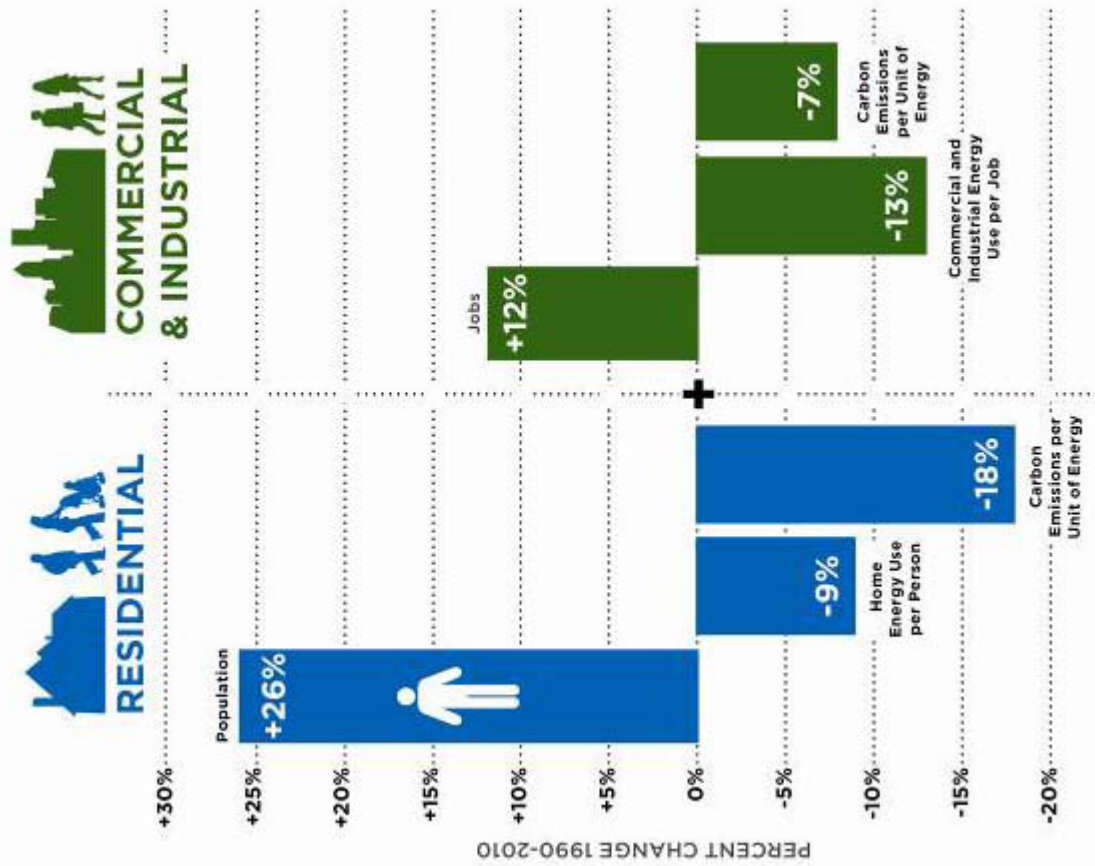
Greenhouse gas emissions trend



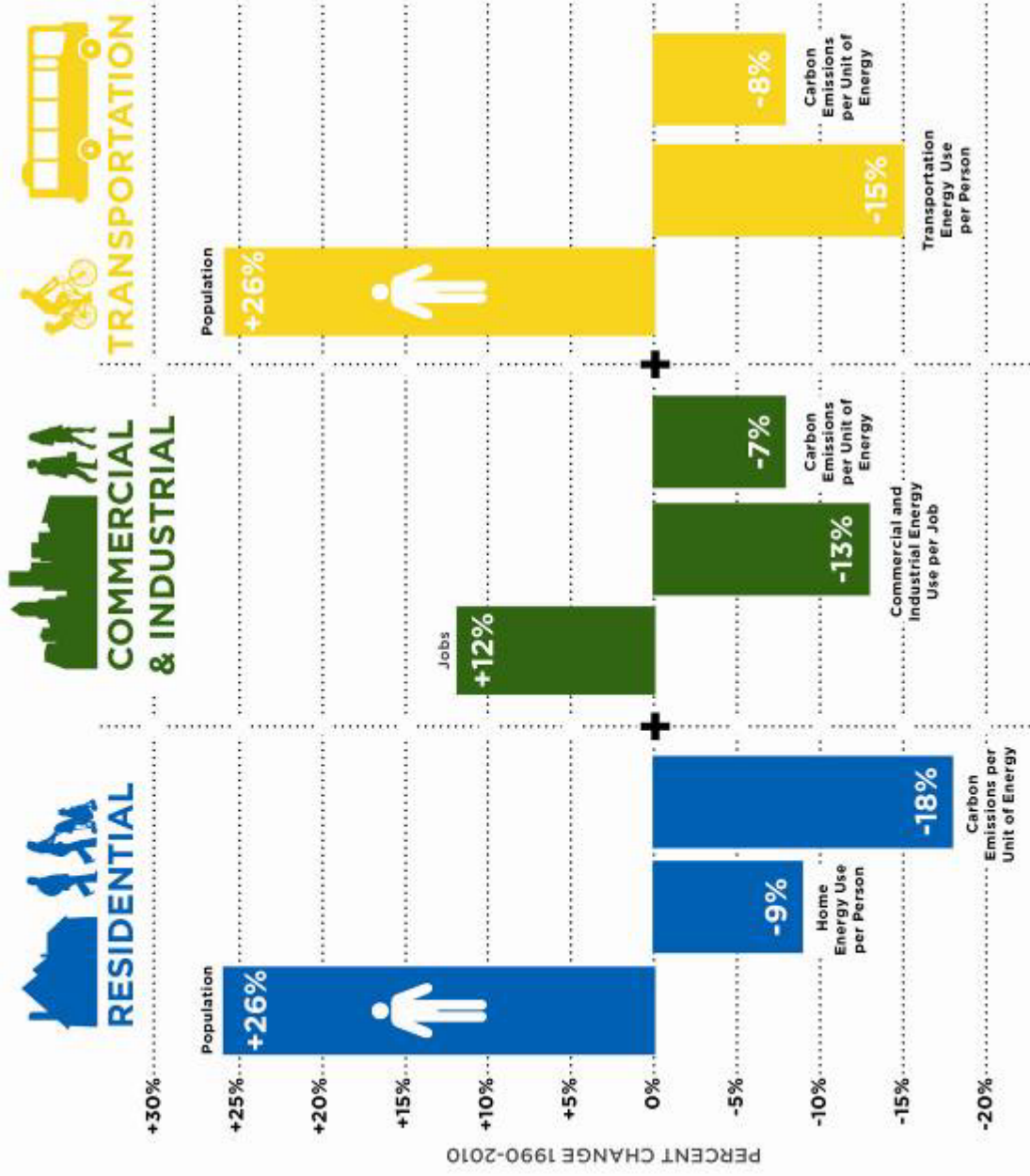
COMPONENTS OF CARBON REDUCTION IN MULTNOMAH COUNTY 1990-2010



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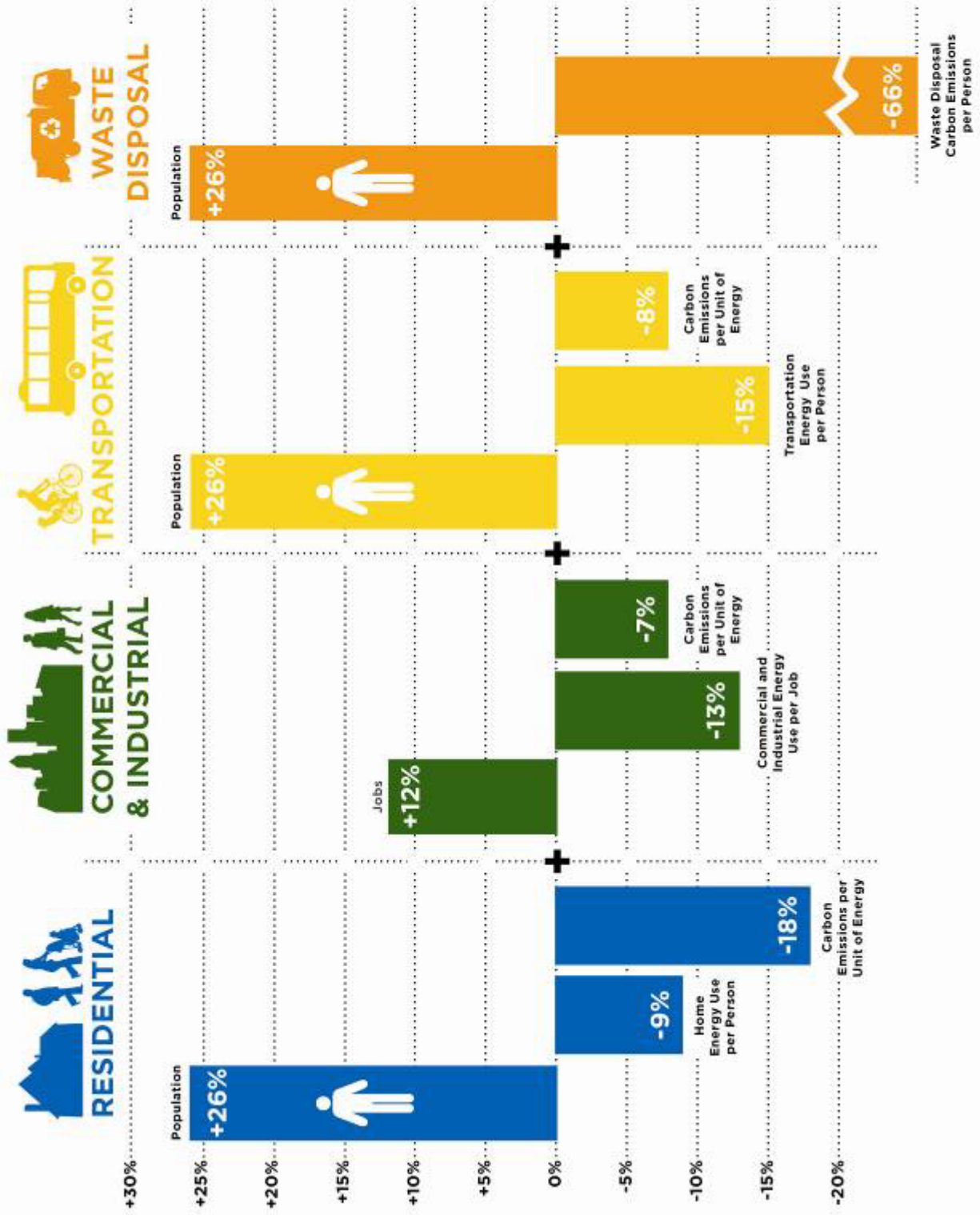


COMPONENTS OF CARBON REDUCTION IN MULTNOMAH COUNTY 1990-2010



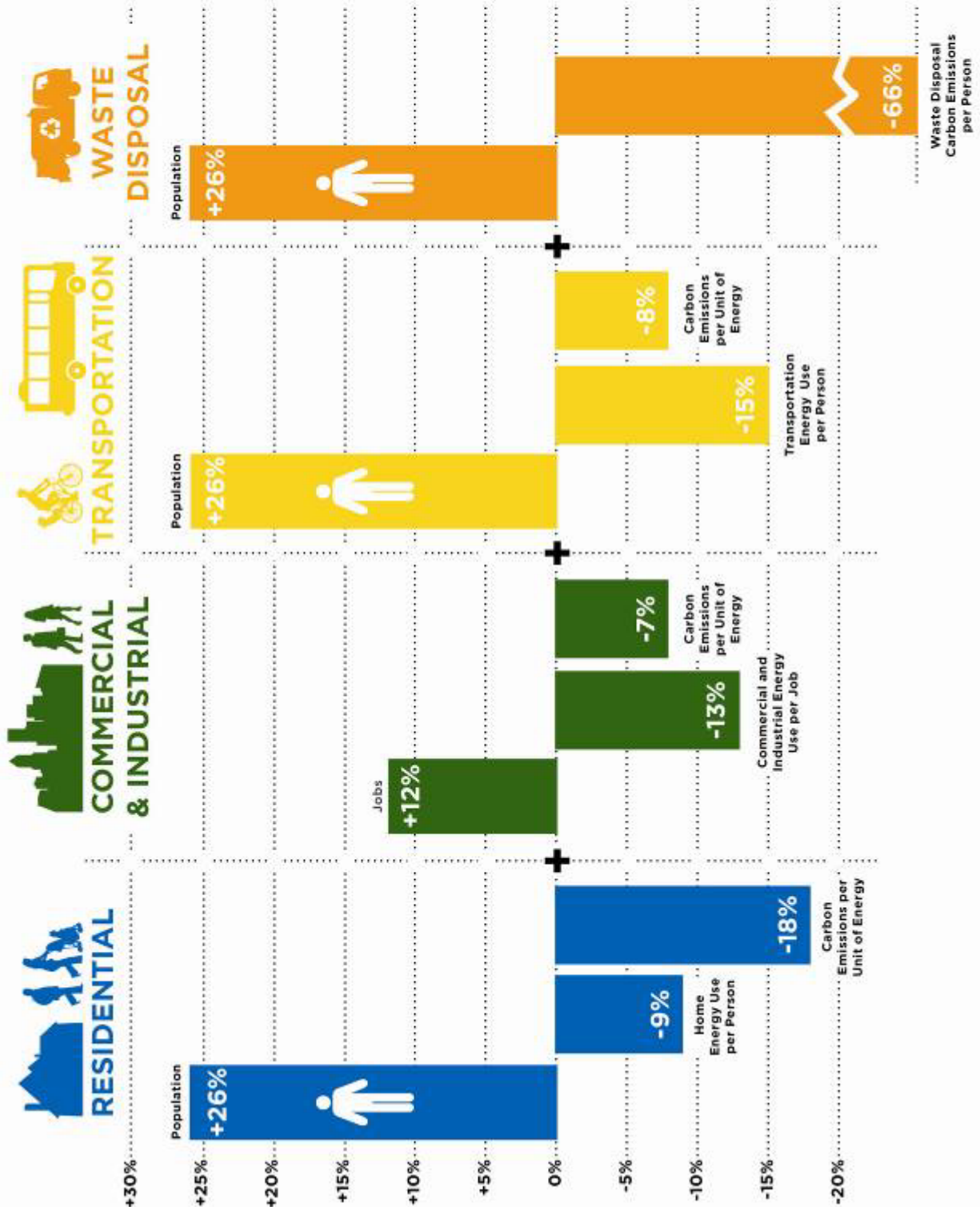
PERCENT CHANGE 1990-2010

COMPONENTS OF CARBON REDUCTION IN MULTNOMAH COUNTY 1990-2010

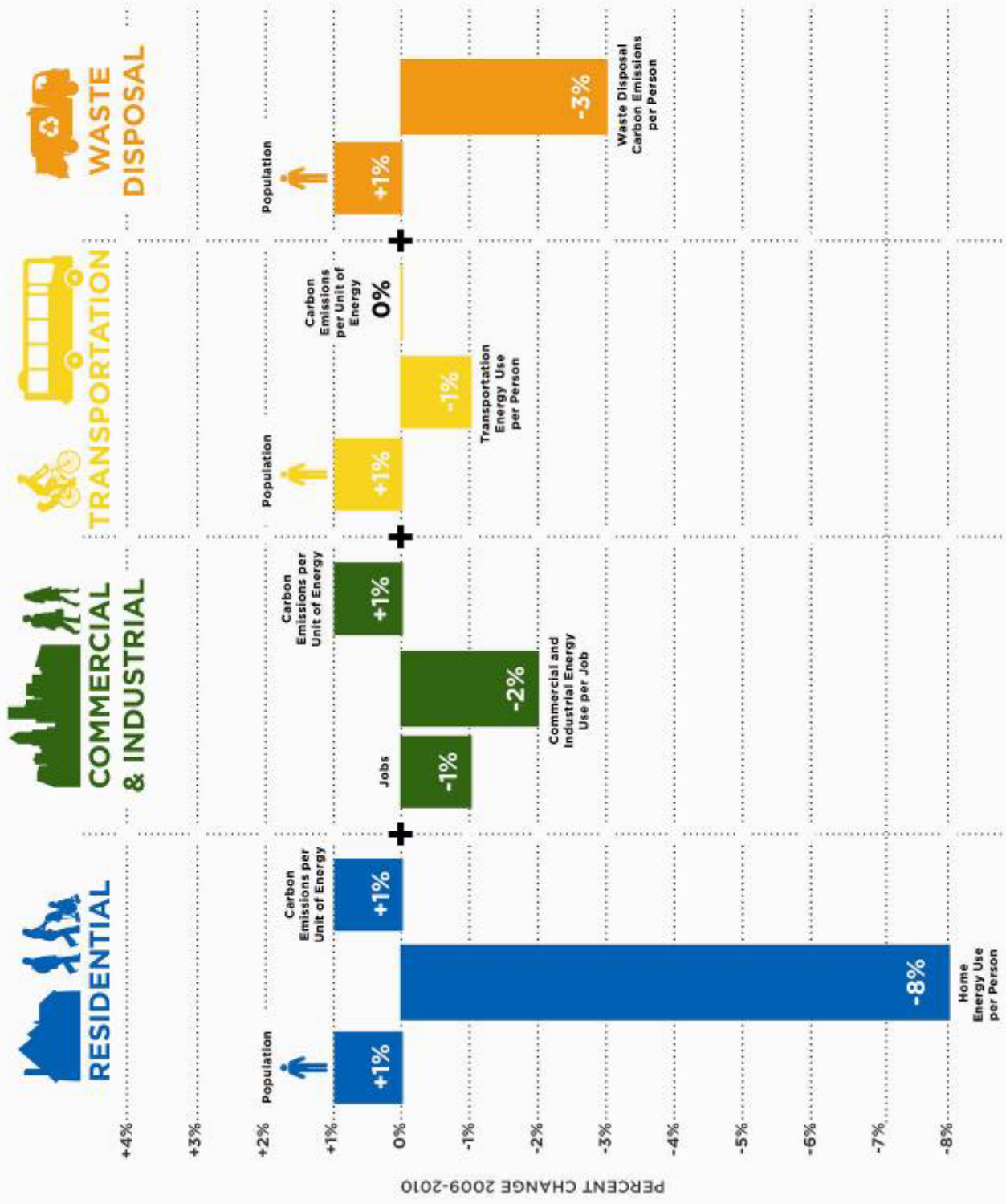


PERCENT CHANGE 1990-2010

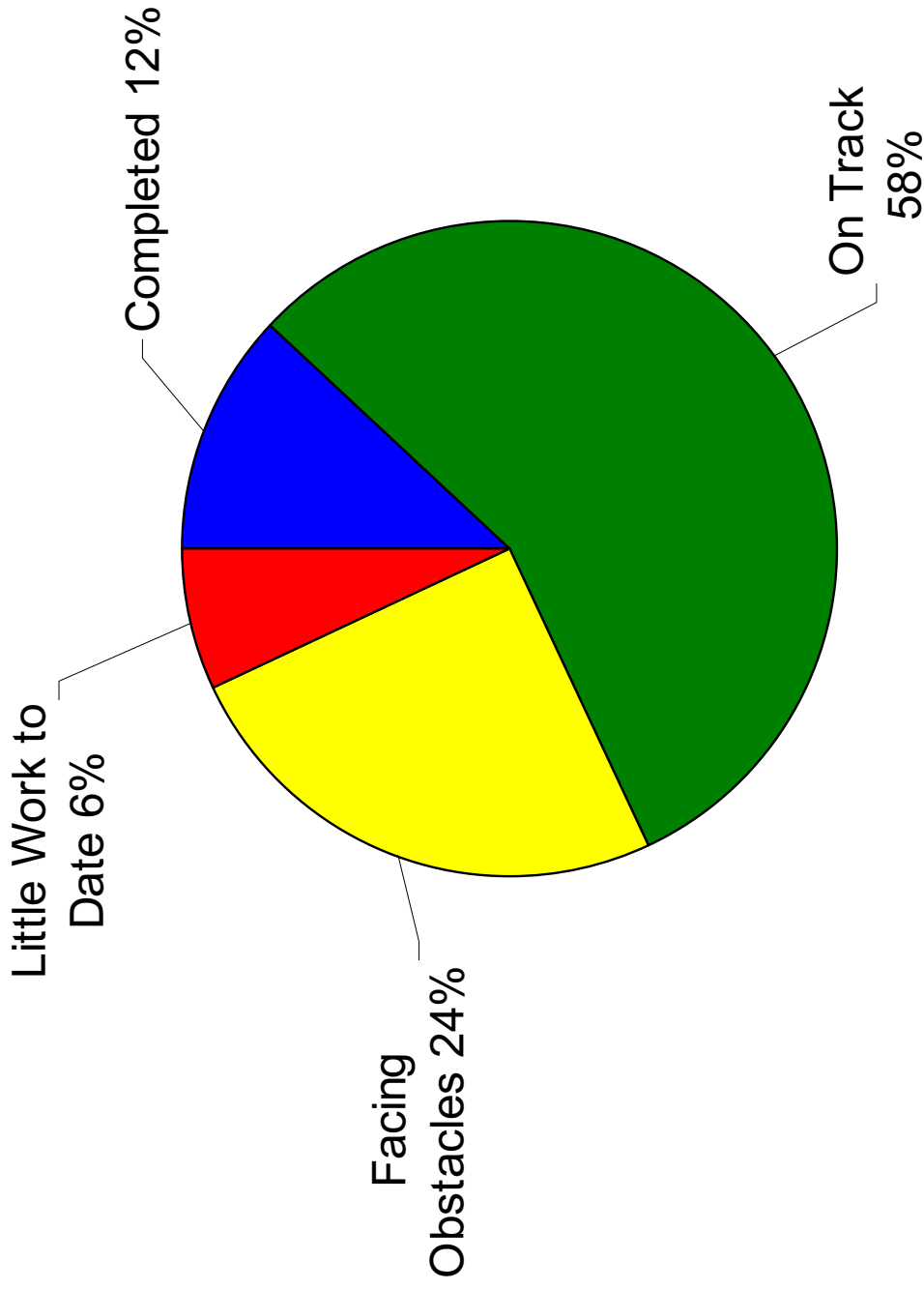

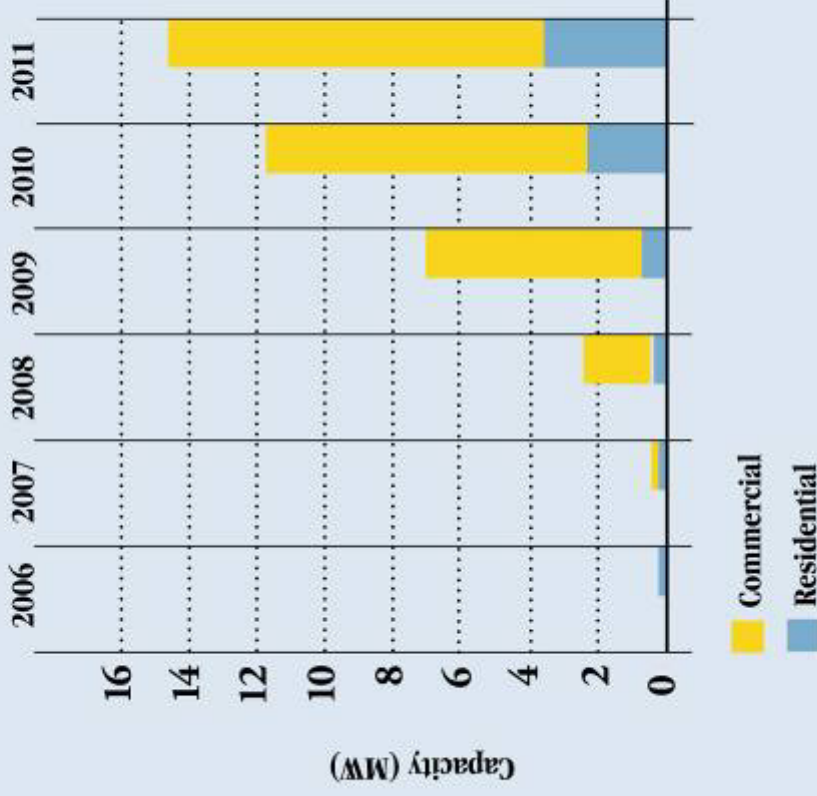

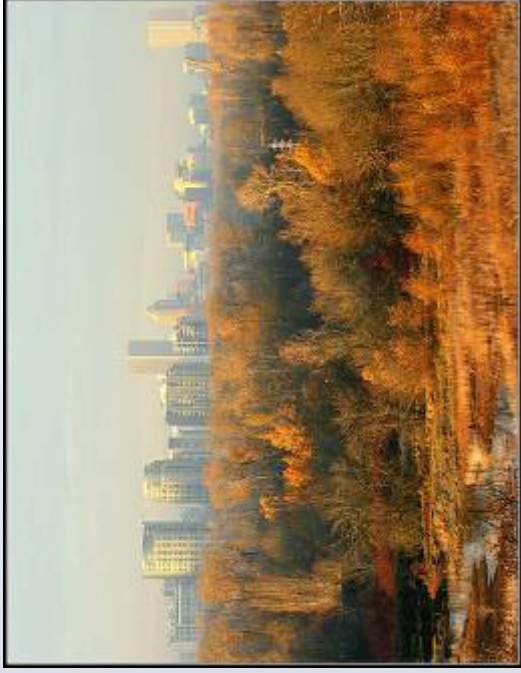
CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- We Expect
 - Increased temperatures (max and min)
 - Changes when and how precipitation falls
 - Weather patterns to continue to be influenced by larger cycles (e.g. El Nino)
- We Just Don't Know
 - Changes in total annual precipitation amounts?
 - Extreme weather events?

- City/County Adaptation Planning
- Regional Collaboration

CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- Built Infrastructure
 - Convened group in April 2011 - Asset Management/Risk-based focus
 - Agreed on expected climate changes
 - Identified potential impacts to infrastructure
 - Listed possible adaptation strategies
 - Tentative list of actions in February 2012
 - Will coordinate with Natural Resources and Health before finalization

CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- Health and Human Systems
- Understand and prepare for vulnerabilities:
 - Public Health Vulnerability Assessment
 - Vulnerable populations project
 - Emergency management lens
- Mapping existing vulnerabilities/populations
- Projecting climate impacts
- Gap analysis of strategies/interventions

CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- Recommendations will focus on:
 - Strategies to protect the most vulnerable
 - Emphasis on actions with co-benefits
 - Key indicators for measuring climate impacts
 - Addressing climate gaps in planning
- Spring 2012 - Identify gaps
- Summer 2012 - Draft recommendations
- Fall 2012 - Synthesize rec., draft joint Plan

CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- Natural Resources
 - In 2011, BES focused the existing “Natural Resources Team”, incorporated to implement the PWMP across bureaus, on Climate Adaptation for 2011-12.
 - Includes representatives from Environmental Services, Parks, Planning and Sustainability, Transportation, and Water.
 - Focus on impact to natural resources and recommendations to improve adaptive capacity throughout the City

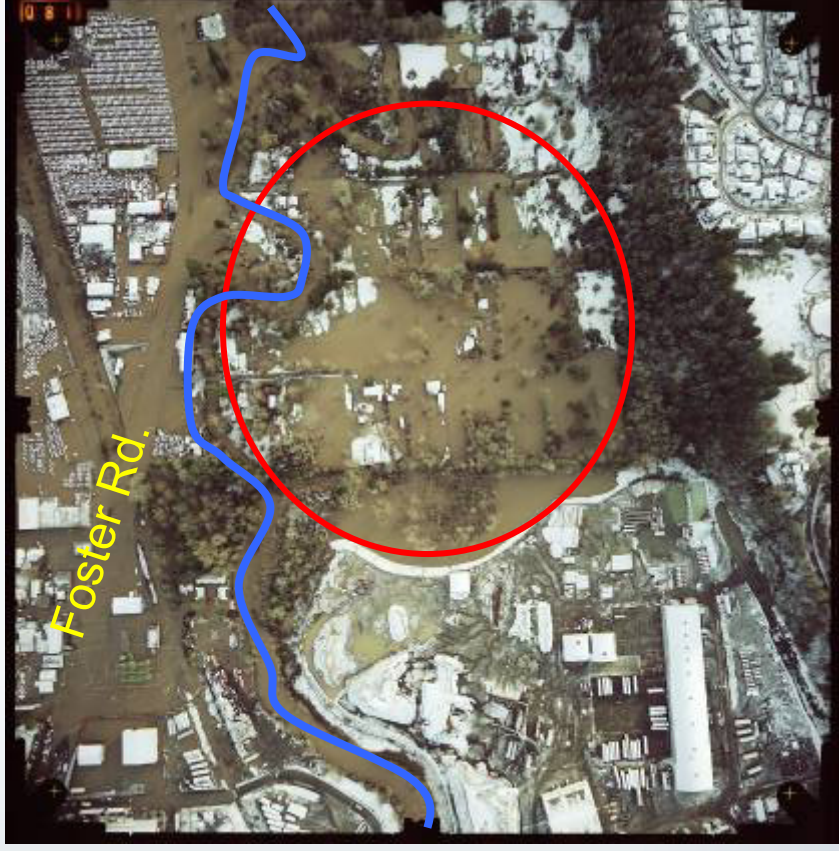
CLIMATE CHANGE PREPARATION

- **Work Plan**
- Literature review of impacts - very reliant on existing work which was summarized by Lovell and Houck in Regional Conservation Strategy. - Done
- Impacts assessment on resources owned, managed, regulated or relied on by the city bureaus - March-April
- Vulnerability assessment - what is the risk? What programs/activities currently exist that mitigate the impacts? - April - May
- Gap analysis - May - June
- Recommendations for adaptation - find synergies, conflicts and no regrets strategies in cooperation. July - August.
