Authorize the Water Bureau Administrator to execute Intergovernmental Agreements and amendments funded by the Lead Hazard Reduction Program (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 184500)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation:

For purposes of complying with the Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule for drinking water, the Water Bureau funds the Lead Hazard Reduction Program. As part of this program, the Water Bureau has funded a lead poisoning prevention program operated by Multnomah County Health Department and Portland Public Schools to implement lead hazard reduction programs.

This proposed legislation would amend Ordinance No. 184500 to allow the Water Bureau Administrator to execute, on behalf of the City, Intergovernmental Agreements for similar lead hazard prevention programs and increase the funding for Lead Hazard Reduction Program agreements by \$185,000 per fiscal year.

ORDINANCE NO.

Authorize the Water Bureau Administrator to execute Intergovernmental Agreements and amendments funded by the Lead Hazard Reduction Program (Ordinance; amend Ordinance No. 184500)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. For the purposes of complying with the Environmental Protection Agency's Lead and Copper Rule for drinking water, the Water Bureau funds and operates a Lead Hazard Reduction Program.
- 2. As part of this program, the Water Bureau has funded a lead poisoning prevention program operated by Multnomah County Health Department to administer a fully dedicated phone line, the LeadLine, which is a centralized information and referral source for lead poisoning prevention information as well as free blood lead screening through existing County health clinics.
- 3. In addition, the program has funded Portland Public Schools to reduce lead paint exposure in early education facilities that primarily serve children six years of age and under.
- 4. Ordinance No. 184500, passed on April 6, 2011, authorized the Water Bureau Administrator to execute grants with community partners to fund lead poisoning prevention programs.
- 5. This ordinance will amend Ordinance No. 184500 to allow the Water Bureau Administrator to authorize and execute Intergovernmental Agreements and amendments involving the Lead Hazard Reduction Program through FY 2013-14 and increase the funding for Lead Hazard Reduction Program agreements by \$185,000 per fiscal year. The amended total to be awarded per fiscal year will not exceed \$410,000. The Water Bureau will request these funds in the FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14 Budgets.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. That the Water Bureau Administrator and Auditor are authorized to execute, on behalf of the City, Intergovernmental Agreements for lead hazard prevention programs.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to pay for said Intergovernmental Agreements.

c. Amendments increasing the total compensation to the Intergovernmental Agreements may be agreed to and executed by the Water Bureau Administrator up to twenty-five percent of the total contract amount. Any increase exceeding twenty-five percent of the total compensation would need City Council approval.
