

ABOUT THE ARTIST:

Sculptor James Gion's work includes both private collections and public spaces. Born in Oregon, he studied fine arts at Oregon State University, receiving a fine arts degree from OSU. While serving in the U.S. military during the Vietnam War, he studied under a Vietnamese sculptor who taught him to make bronze castings. After college, James returned to Asia, living and

working in Japan for ten years, maintaining a studio producing works in clay and plaster. He was commissioned by the city of Portland to produce the bronze columns at the Japanese American Historical Plaza at Gov. Tom McCall Waterfront Park. James is a resident of Northeast Portland.

The Portland Immigrant Statue will be a regional attraction expressing a proud statement. The Portland Immigrant Statue symbolizes this enduring story, and expresses gratitude to all immigrants for their past, present and future sacrifices and contributions.

Land of the Free Level - \$10,000
