- 7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS</u>: Ordinance Numbers 182543 and 182545 adopted on February 18, 2009 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Deltawood LID Phase 1 & 2 (BES Project No. E09070) and (Water Bureau Project No. W01423).
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project is \$700,000.00. Funding for this project is available under owner cost center WAEN000007, Portland Water Bureau Project No. W01423 and under Bureau of Environmental Services Project No. E09070.
- **9.** RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept Recommendation to award contract to Canby Excavating, Inc in the amount of \$499,095.95.
- 10. SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to construct an 8-inch sanitary sewer mainline system, with one 6-inch service lateral for each property and other necessary appurtenances and connect it to the existing City of Portland sanitary sewer system on NE Walker Street. The project also includes constructing a 6-inch

water system, including fire hydrants; and connecting the new water system to the existing City of Portland public water system; install metered domestic services; and remove existing 2-inch metered Service.
