7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) is applying to gain access to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS). IPAWS allows PBEM to deliver emergency public messages via multiple federal public notification systems including the Commercial Mobile Alert System (CMAS), National Weather Service Dissemination Systems, and other future systems. CMAS access will allow PBEM to transmit localized and citywide emergency text-based alerts directly to CMAScompatible wireless phones with no subscriber opt-in requirements. Accordingly, this would allow targeted warnings to reach residents and visitors as well as public safety professionals. PBEM would like to enter into a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with FEMA IPAWS to allow access to the federal public notification systems described above. This MOA will allow PBEM to access the IPAWS system using the City's existing Community Emergency Notification System (Public Alerts) and emergency management software platform (WebEOC).
