ORDINANCE No. 185310

*Amend Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to finalize a feasibility study of ecosystem restoration and environmental dredging options in the Lower Willamette River under the Water Resources Development Act (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 52070)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. In April 2003, the City entered into a feasibility cost sharing agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to evaluate ecosystem restoration and environmental dredging options in the Lower Willamette River under the Water Resources Development Act ordinance 177395. The monetary amount of the agreement was \$500,000.
- 2. Amendment 1 to the Feasibility Cost Sharing between the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the City for the Lower Willamette Ecosystem Restoration Feasibility Study was executed on April 2008 in order to increase total study costs. The in-kind match was increased by \$1.48 million for a total of \$1.98 million.
- 3. Amendment 2 added the Port of Portland as a co-sponsor for the study along with the City.
- 4. This Amendment 3 increases the local in-kind match by \$330,000 to a total of \$2.3 million. The additional in-kind match will be split between the City and the Port of Portland. The City's share will be half, or \$165,000. The final feasibility study will provide initial engineering and environmental background assessment for restoration sites and three environmental dredging sites throughout the Lower Willamette River.
- 5. The City has a strong interest in ensuring that the Lower Willamette is restored to a condition that protects human health and the environment in a timely and cost-effective manner. Continuing this agreement with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is a precursor to obtaining significant federal ecosystem restoration and environmental dredging funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Utilities is authorized to sign an amendment with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for the purpose described into Section 1 in a form substantially in accordance with the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Environmental Remediation fund when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
- Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the City, the Port of Portland and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have related projects currently underway. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
