Subject: NATOA Community Broadband Award: Portland's Integrated Regional Network Enterprise

(IRNE)

The City of Portland's Integrated Regional Network Enterprise (IRNE) system, which provides or enables highspeed Internet service to schools, libraries and local government offices throughout Multnomah County, has been recognized with a national Community Broadband award.

The National Association of Telecommunications Officers and Advisors (NATOA) has honored Portland by naming the IRNE system as one of a handful of recipients of NATOA's 2009 Community Broadband Awards. This honor is awarded only for exceptional leadership and innovative programs that champion community interests and broadband deployment in cities nationwide.

The NATOA press release announcing the award states: "NATOA's Community Broadband Awards proudly recognize the people, communities, and organizations that lead the nation in promoting community interests through broadband projects."

Award recipients are chosen by NATOA annually based on extraordinary efforts, achievements, and innovation in community-based approaches to broadband. These individuals, organizations, and communities have distinguished themselves on a national basis in the effort to ensure that more American communities and citizens benefit from new technology.

The Integrated Regional Network Enterprise (IRNE) is a public communications system operated by the City of Portland. The IRNE system was developed and launched by the City's Com-Net Division (now Bureau of Technology Services) with the help of substantial assets and resources developed by the Office of Cable Communications & Franchise Management. IRNE provides fast, inexpensive internet access to schools, libraries and local government offices throughout Multnomah County on its network and through an interconnection with Comcast's INET. It was planned, designed, and built to share the region's publicly owned communications assets.
