### 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Raymond Svela, age 84 at the time, was with his family in downtown Portland on July 19, 2009. One of their destinations that day was to view the Sand in the City event, organized and sponsored annually by Kids on the Block (KOB) Awareness Project. Pioneer Courthouse Square, Inc. (PCS), the City's agent that manages the Square, had issued KOB a permit to use the Square for the sand castle event. Minutes after entering the Square, Mr. Svela fell on the steps leading down to the KGW studio, suffering injuries. Mr. Svela filed a tort claim notice weeks later, and the City denied the claim and attempted to tender it to PCS and KOB. Subsequently, Mr. Svela hired an attorney, who ultimately filed a lawsuit in February 2011, alleging negligence by all three parties. The negligence attributed to the City was for the alleged 'unreasonably dangerous condition' of the steps near the KGW studio, which plaintiff contends arise from a failure to design and build the steps in conformance with building codes. Plaintiff further alleged the City had responsibility in positioning an entrance to the event in a manner that forced persons to encounter these steps. The City denied all allegations.

The case was set for trial in May 2012, and in an extended mediation session spanning the course of several weeks in March and April, the parties reached a settlement to resolve the litigation. The three named defendants (KOB, PCS and City) have agreed to pay proportional shares of the settlement, with the primary permittee / event holder KOB taking 60%, PCS 20% and the City 20%. Accordingly, the City's contribution in this matter will be \$25,500.

### 8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$25,500 from the liability fund.

### 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Raymond Svela bodily injury lawsuit in the sum of \$25,500.
