

- I. **RECOMMENDATION.** Extend the term of Lewis and Clark College's franchise to June 30, 2014.
- II. **BACKGROUND.** Over the last 18 years the City Council has granted several telecommunications franchises, and many will expire soon. City staff has reviewed the terms and conditions of all of these franchises and is working with industry in an effort to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of all franchises.

On October 26, 2011, the City Council adopted non-emergency Ordinance No. 184957, amending Title 17 of the Portland City Code. Among other matters, the ordinance updated, clarified and reorganized various code sections. The Bureau of Transportation is in the process of developing and adopting administrative regulations to implement the revised code provisions. This process will affect some of the standardized franchise language. As PBOT works to complete this process, the Office for Community Technology recommends that the City Council extend existing franchises.
