The Police Bureau did not seek public input in the development of this item because it relates to internal City government services. The bureau and Procurement Services intend to take extra care to make sure such transactions are appropriate, meet City procurement guidelines, and take extra steps to make sure such transactions have no appearance of impropriety even if the transactions are otherwise legally appropriate.
Additionally, Extreme Products, LLC is a registered Minority owned enterprise; a business relationship with them would expand the City's capability to patronize businesses with this designation. This patronage is generally uncontroversial and so public involvement was not sought.

ORDINANCE No.

* Authorize City to execute contracts with Extreme Products, LLC (Ordinance; waive Code Section 5.33.070)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Extreme Products, LLC is a company located in the Portland area whose principal, John A. Myers, is an employee of the Portland Police Bureau. Extreme Products, LLC has a line of products that the City might find useful, including items for the Portland Police Bureau and Portland Fire and Rescue.
- 2. Extreme Products, LLC desires to do business with the City and supply it with product in accordance with City Code and policies.
- 3. City Code 5.33.070 limits the Chief Procurement Officer's authority to award contracts to, or purchase goods and services from City employees, or from businesses with which a City employee is associated when the employee owns or has 10% or more of its stock. Extreme Products, LLC is a company that falls within the requirements of the Code section.
- 4. Whenever purchasing from companies in which City employees are involved, the City wants to make sure that all transactions are transparent and that such companies do not receive more favorable treatment than other product suppliers.
- 5. Mr. Myers has requested the City waive the requirements of Section 5.33.070 thereby allowing the Chief Procurement Officer to sign contracts between Extreme Products and the City. In addition, Mr. Myers has requested that the City permit other City bureaus to issue purchase orders to Extreme Products, LLC and permit bureaus to purchase supplies directly and without competition when the amount does not exceed \$5,000.
- 6. The Portland Police Bureau seeks the Council's authorization on behalf of Mr. Myers to allow the Chief Procurement Officer to enter into contracts with Extreme Products in accordance with City Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Chief Procurement Officer is given authority to execute contracts with Extreme Products, LLC on behalf of the City for the purposes identified in Section 1 without the necessity of any further ordinance provided the procurements meet all the requirements of City procurement rules, polices and regulations. In any circumstance where the Chief Procurement Officer is not comfortable with executing a contract with Extreme Products, LLC, the Chief Procurement Officer may refer that contract to City Council for approval.

b. The Commissioner and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver check(s) payable to the successful contractor chargeable to the appropriate authorization and accounting center when demand is presented and approved by the proper authorities.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because a delay in proceeding with the authorization may prevent the City and Extreme Products, LLC the mutual benefits of this ordinance; therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
