7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Risk Management Services has reached a compromise settlement of a claim brought against the City by Keith Munn and Anita Munn. This settlement is subject to the approval of the City Council. We are recommending the City pay the sum of \$33,459.66 to settle the claim.

The claimants own a rental duplex located at 3571 and 3573 NE 122nd Avenue. Their claim against the City arises from damage to the sewer lateral that ran from the duplex to the sewer main in NE 122nd Avenue, which caused a sewage backup into the interior spaces of the two rental units. The City's investigation determined that the sewer laterals from the claimants' duplex had been damaged during excavation for a BES project in NE 122nd Avenue.

Direct repair costs totaled \$30,016.53. Costs for relocating the tenants during the repairs totaled \$3,443.13. The total agreed damage amount is therefore \$33,459.66. Risk Management has advanced \$10,000 of this amount (\$5,000 to Mr. Munn and \$5,000 to Mrs. Munn).

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$33,459.66 from the liability fund.

Approve settlement of Keith Munn & Anita Munn property damage claim in the sum of \$33,459.66.
