ORDINANCE No. 185363

*Accept tax-foreclosed property from Multnomah County for riparian and flood management purposes. (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Multnomah County offers tax-foreclosed property to jurisdictions within its boundaries if the property can be put to public use. Prior to public hearing at which the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners will make final resolution of the tax-foreclosed properties, the City must formally request the parcels it wishes to acquire and agree to accept them.
- 2. Bureau of Environmental Services staff has reviewed the current list of available tax-foreclosed properties and determined that one parcel meets bureau program needs for riparian and flood management. The Legal description of the parcel is attached as Exhibit A.
- 3. The Bureau of Environmental Services will accept responsibility for the on-going maintenance costs of the parcel identified in Exhibit A, which the Director of Bureau of Environmental Services estimates to be \$500.00 per year.
- 4. There is no monetary consideration to the County for acquisition of this parcel, and no up-front cost associated to the acceptance of this parcel. Should the property be used for something other than habitat and or riparian or floodplain management purposes, title will revert to the County.
- 5. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services recommends that the City request the parcel legally described in Exhibit A, and accept it into the City's property inventory once they have been transferred from Multnomah County.

NOW, THEREFORE, The Council directs that:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services or designee is hereby directed to notify the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners that the City of Portland formally requests and will accept ownership of the parcels listed in the Attached Exhibit A, and to execute all documents necessary to transfer the parcels once approved as to form by the City Attorney; and,
- b. In accepting responsibility for the parcel being transferred to the Bureau of Environmental Services, Council acknowledges the need to fund annual ongoing maintenance costs, which are estimated to be \$500. The property will be managed as a protected riparian and floodplain resources.

Section 2. The Council declares that an emergency exists because the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners has already approved this transaction and completed the documents necessary to execute and record the property transfer and forwarded them to the City. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by Council.
