I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize a Professional Services Contract for design services for Category 3, Planning Package 5, Underground Injection Control (UIC) Project

II. **BACKGROUND**

The City uses Underground Injection Control (UIC) facilities, commonly known as sumps, to control street storm runoff on Southeast Portland. These facilities are permitted under the City's Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) Permit. The subject permit, issued by DEQ in 2005, identified 219 UICs that are noncompliant with DEQ regulations and must be corrected by 2015. This project will retrofit 46 of the 219 UICs.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The established cost for design services is \$398,272.72. Funds are available in the Sewer Systems Operating Fund, FY 2011 – 2012 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, E10322.D14.

IV. **LEGAL ISSUES**

Completion of design is required to meet the WPCF Permit, therefore completion of the project is mandated to avoid being out of compliance.
