

# ORDINANCE No. 185408

Authorize grant agreements and Intergovernmental Agreements with eleven non-profit and public entities related to the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

1. The Portland City Council adopted the Clean River Program on April 6, 1990. In 1995, the Bureau of Environmental Services developed the Community Watershed Stewardship Program (CWSP) to provide grant funds and technical assistance for citizen led watershed projects. On March 8, 2006, the Council adopted the 2005 Portland Watershed Management Plan which describes actions for watershed health including citizen led activities such as natural area revegetation, education, involvement and stewardship. On May 2, 2012, Council adopted resolution #36920, reaffirming the City's commitment to watershed health.
2. These grants have been selected for FY12-13: Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center Engaging At-Risk Youth (\$9,819), PCC Sylvania Habitat Restoration Team Natural Area Park Restoration and Education (\$6,700), Friends of Tryon Creek Watershed Restoration Mentor Program (\$10,000), Pilgrim Lutheran Church Rain Garden (\$6,500), Gilbert Park School Outdoor Learning Area (\$10,000), Franciscan Montessori Earth School Windows into Wetlands (\$3,900), Groundwork Portland Green Teams (\$8,000), Franklin Gardens Nature Trail (\$7,450), Tabor Commons Sustainable Stormwater Display Shelter (\$8,100), Beach School Stormwater Gardens (\$8,160) and Depave Word & Spirit Church Parking Lot Greening (\$10,000). Additional community projects will be awarded mini-grants not exceeding \$500 each for the purchase of native plants for stormwater and natural area restoration projects (\$6,871).
3. The established cost is \$95,500. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 12-13 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Cost Center ESWS000007, 529000.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute grant agreements and IGAs for the purpose described in Section 1, in substantially the same forms as Exhibits A and B attached herein, in the amount of \$95,500.
- b. The Director of the Bureau of Environmental Services is authorized to execute amendments to these grant agreements and IGAs that do not increase the grant amount.
- c. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
