This Resolution adopts the Pearl District Access and Circulation Plan as non-Binding City Policy. It contains a series of Action Items that will be developed into projects as part of future budgeting processes. The Action Items focus on increasing multi-modal access throughout the Pearl District, with an emphasis on providing safer intersection crossings and bicycle facilities.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

A stakeholder Advisory Committee was convened to guide development of the Plan. The Pearl District Neighborhood Association, Pearl District Business Association, Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committees, the Northwest District Association, and the Pacific Northwest College of Art were active participants. Staff from the Water Bureau, Bureau of Environmental Services, Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, Portland Development Commission, and Oregon Department of Transportation served as technical review staff throughout the process.

The Stakeholder Advisory Committee was directly involved in all aspects of the development of the plan and Action Items, from initial concept development to final recommendations. In addition, there were two public open houses where staff received feedback from the general public.
