- 5. Purpose of Agenda Item: The Code amendments in this Ordinance include a) extending the timeline for residential collection vehicles to come into compliance with the fleet replacement requirement from January 2014 to January 2016, b) allowing collection vehicles retrofitted with a diesel particulate filter through a Metro grant-funded program to be replaced at a later date, and c) providing greater flexibility to garbage and recycling companies in meeting vehicle replacement timelines.
- 6. History of Agenda Item/Background: In September 2008, City Council adopted Ordinance 182190 establishing clean fleet requirements for waste hauling companies including requirements for fuel use and truck replacement. This amendment of Code Section 17.102.050 will extend the timeline for residential collection vehicles to come into compliance with the fleet replacement requirement (all residential collection vehicles must be twelve years old or newer) from January 1, 2014 to January 1, 2016. Extending the compliance timeline for residential collection vehicles will reduce the impact of new truck purchases on residential garbage and recycling rates, as the rate



increases will be spread out over a longer period of time. Extending the timeline also allows interested garbage and recycling companies to pursue purchases of trucks that run on Compressed Natural Gas (CNG).

This amendment will allow collection vehicles that have been retrofitted with a diesel particulate filter through a Metro grant-funded program to be replaced at a later date in order to make the best use of Metro's investment and lessen impact on ratepayers.

This amendment will allow garbage and recycling companies to propose a schedule for meeting vehicle replacement timelines, simplifying compliance tracking and providing greater flexibility for garbage and recycling companies to meet vehicle replacement deadlines.

Finally, this amendment will clean up and clarify the code, including guidance on which vehicles must be replaced. Code cleanups are suggested because some sections of the code are outdated and unnecessary, while other sections would benefit from greater clarity.

- 8. What individuals or groups are or would be supportive or opposed to this action? Garbage and recycling companies and ratepayers may be supportive of this action. The action to extend the compliance deadline was recommended by the Portland Utilities Review Board.

This is an update to existing City Code and changes the timeline for fleet replacement requirements.
