7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The City of Portland has been awarded an FY 2011 Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) Grant #11-170. The City of Portland is the official administrator for the UASI regional grants. The Columbia County is a stakeholder in the UASI region. The FY 2011 UASI Grant award of \$4,925,160 (Ordinance #185227) is for addressing the unique equipment, training, planning, exercise and operational needs of large urban areas.

The City of Portland needs to amend an existing Intergovernmental Agreement with Columbia County. This agreement utilizes grant funds for the purchase and distribution of equipment, supplies and services procured as a result of UASI Grants.
