a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

Mostly positive. Increased pedestrian and bicycle access and increased safety for bicyclists and pedestrians within communities and across the 5.6 mile long corridor linking the Central City to the Gateway District in East Portland

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The Sullivan's Gulch Trail Project Advisory Committee (PAC) was formed to represent diverse community interests. The committee included representatives of the Mount Tabor Neighborhood, Portland Parks Board, North Tabor Neighborhood, Providence Health System, Latino Network, East Portland,/Hazelwood Neighborhood, Asian Family Center, Rose City Park Neighborhood, Hollywood Senior Center and the Sullivan's Gulch Trail Committee. The PAC met five times during the development of the plan.

City staff also conducted two public Open Houses, maintained a project website and made a special effort to reach out to property owners affected by the proposed trail alignment. Letters were mailed to all property owners adjacent to the gulch offering one-on-one meetings. Individual meetings were held with all property owners who expressed interest or concerns about the potential trail.

Presentations were made to the City's bicycle and pedestrian advisory committees and the Portland Commission on Disabilities' Subcommittee on Accessibility in the Built Environment.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The Project Advisory Committee developed the principles and criteria for concept design which resulted in the recommendations which are being presented to Council for adoption.
