7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance would settle a lawsuit brought by former Bureau of Maintenance employee Kelly Shephard for a total of \$85,000 and formally end the employment relationship between Mr. Shephard and the City. Mr. Shephard brings claims under state and federal family medical leave and disability discrimination laws.

After mediation and direct negotiation with Mr. Shephard's attorneys, outside counsel hired to defend the case, Risk Management, the Bureau of Human Resources, and the City Attorneys Office recommend settling this case for a total of \$85,000, inclusive of Mr. Shephard's attorney's fees and costs. A condition of the settlement is that Mr. Shephard, who has been laid off for budgetary reasons, dismisses all of his claims and gives up his rights to apply for any future jobs with the City.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$75,000 from the liability fund and \$10,000 from PBOT in the form of wages.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Kelly Shephard bodily injury lawsuit in the sum of \$85,000.
