#### 8. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The City applied to the U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) for the FY12 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program on May 11, 2012. The USDOJ OJP BJA has notified the City that it will award a grant for the FY12 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program to the City in the amount of \$502,012.

Intergovernmental Agreements have been executed with Multnomah County and the City of Gresham in order to obligate agency roles and responsibilities and define sub-recipient responsibilities. Multnomah County will receive \$193,707, the City of Gresham will receive \$61,766 and the City of Portland will receive \$246,539. The grant period is October 1, 2011, through September 30, 2015.

The Bureau will retain 1.0 FTE limited-term Audit Lieutenant for 10 months (\$106,539) and provide funding to LifeWorks NW New Options for Women for prostitution outreach and intervention (\$140,000).

No legal or controversial issues. There is no voluntary citizen participation. There are no links to current City policies. Multnomah County and the City of Gresham will be sub-recipients.

#### 9. FINANCIAL IMPACT AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT STATEMENT

The USDOJ will reimburse the City a maximum of \$502,012 for program expenses incurred by the Police Bureau and its joint applicants Multnomah County and the City of Gresham.

The City will incur TriMet payroll tax expenses not eligible for federal reimbursement for the Audit lieutenant position. The expenses will be provided by funds from FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14 Police Bureau program budget appropriations. There is no match requirement.
