7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This ordinance would settle a class action brought on behalf of homeless individuals without shelter challenging the enforcement of the City's anti-camping, temporary structures and park exclusion ordinances as unconstitutional.

Individual plaintiffs allege that they were harmed and suffered the loss of property in the past when they were told by police to move from the public right of way. The settlement would provide individuals with reimbursement for lost property in the total amount of \$3,200 and \$37,000 to the Oregon Law Center for their attorneys fees on this case. The amount for attorneys fees will be transferred to the Portland Housing Bureau to be used as rent-assistance funds.

The plaintiffs sought an injunction from a court ruling that the City's ordinances are illegal because there are no other alternative places for many homeless people to sleep. In order to address this complaint, the ordinance would authorize the City to enter into a settlement agreement which defines particular terms of the City's camping and temporary structures ordinance, sets out advance notice provisions prior to any citation and property removal, and clarifies jurisdictional issues related to ODOT and Parks property.

It is the recommendation of Risk Management and the City Attorney's office that this settlement be approved by ordinance in order to resolve the lawsuit and clarify policies regarding when and where people can sleep on public property

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$40,200 from the liability fund.
