The City wishes to accept a grant from the U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), National Institute of Justice (NIJ) for the FY 2012 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program. The grant period is October 1, 2012, through September 30, 2013.

The grant will allow the Police Bureau's Forensic Evidence Division to complete their conversion from 35 mm film to digital imaging technology with the purchase digital cameras, personal computers, monitors and specialized software.

9. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The City applied to the U.S. Department of Justice (USDOJ) Office of Justice Programs (OJP), National Institute of Justice (NIJ) for the FY 2012 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program on May 16, 2012. The USDOJ has notified the City that it will award a grant in the amount of \$49,675.

This is the bureau's fourth NIJ Coverdell award in the past four years. In 2008, the Forensic Evidence Division (FED) conducted a needs assessment and determined migration to digital imaging was warranted. The FY 2012 Coverdell grant will allow FED to complete the conversion from 35mm film to digital imaging technology with the of purchase digital cameras, personal computers, monitors and specialized software. The grant period is October 1, 2012, through September 30, 2013.

There are no legal or controversial issues. There is no voluntary citizen participation. There are no links to current City policies and no other governmental participation.
