a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

This ordinance relates to construction of two new pump stations. When the pump station projects enter the construction phase, typical construction impacts are anticipated, including some noise, possible vibration, and traffic impacts. Additionally, properties currently not connected to the public sewer system will have three years to connect following completion of the pump stations.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The South Airport Sewer projects have been in progress for the last ten years, with outreach being provided for multiple sewer extensions and pump stations.

Staff has provided information by postal mail to approximately 200 properties over this ten year period. Information regarding these two specific pump stations was included in factsheets mailed throughout 2009. Staff has also maintained contact with the North Portland Neighborhood Services coalition office. A meeting with the Columbia Slough Watershed Council was scheduled for January 30, 2012. A presentation to the Columbia Corridor Association is being scheduled.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

The location of the NE 47th Avenue pump station was shifted slightly in order to avoid removing several trees. The shift in location was a direct result of concerns expressed to staff by the Columbia Slough Watershed Council.

I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize a contract and provide payment for construction of the South Airport Basin Phase 4 Pump Stations and NE 47th Ave. Frontage Improvements, Project Number E06790 (Ordinance)

II. BACKGROUND

The South Airport Basin is an unsewered area of NE Portland north of Columbia Blvd., sited approximately between NE Colwood Way and NE 42nd Avenue. The South Airport Project consists of several phased projects to bring sewer service to this area. Phase 4 will involve construction of two, new pump stations. One of the pump stations is located at NE 42nd Ave. at Buffalo Street; the other pump station will be located at NE 47th Ave. adjacent to the Whitaker Ponds.

Frontage improvements required by the Bureau of Development Services (BDS) for a building permit have been designed by Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT). The current design for the project reflects the combined efforts of BES and PBOT, in accordance with permit requirements of BDS and Portland Parks and Recreation Bureau.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The final engineer's estimate for the cost of construction is \$3,320,000. The project is included in the adopted BES CIP budget.

IV. **LEGAL ISSUES**

No legal issues related to the proposed contract have been identified.

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V. CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES

No controversial issues related to the proposed contract have been identified.

VI. LINK TO CURRENT CITY POLICIES

The project is consistent with the BES CIP process. Construction will be performed in accordance with the City of Portland Standard Construction Specifications.

VII. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Citizen participation was not pursued for this project because both new pump stations will not be accessible to the public.

VIII. OTHER GOVERNMENT PARTICIPATION

PBOT designed the NE 47th Ave. frontage improvements. BES has obtained a Non Parks Use Permit from the Portland Parks and Recreation Bureau, which has reviewed the plans. The pump station at NE 47th is included in the May 2006 Whitaker Ponds Master Plan developed by Portland Parks & Recreation.
