a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

- Construction will impact the community with the usual noise, dust and traffic restrictions.
- o There will be only two areas where the road will be closed, on Klickitat between 23rd and 24th at the Madeleine School; and at Klickitat and Alameda at the traffic island. The closure at Madeleine School will become permanent for vehicle traffic, but will remain open to pedestrians and cyclists.
- As a result of this project pedestrian safety will be improved with improved ADA corners and crossings.
- Local basement flooding will be improved with the capture and treatment of stormwater, preventing it from entering the combined sewer system.
- Safety at the Madeleine School and sports field will be greatly improved by the permanent closure of Klickitat in that block. Students cross over Klickitat each day between the school and the field. During summer and weekend the sports field is also heavily used by neighbors.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

- Eliot, Irvington, Sabin, Alameda, Beaumont-Wilshire, Rose City, and Roseway neighborhoods, and representatives of Portland Public Schools (Alameda Elementary) and representatives of the Madeleine School and Parish have all received information on this project through out its design phase.
- The design team has worked closely with all property owners adjacent to a planned green street stormwater facility on its design and planting plan.
- Ongoing information has been provided to residents and property owners all along the route, and within several blocks to either side of the route.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

- Through our work with the Alameda Neighborhood association, and their neighbors, we were able to collect a significant amount of information on local basement seepage issues which directly affected the design of this project.
- O Property owners adjacent to planned green street stormwater facilities were active in choosing the vegetation design of that facility and its trees.
- O Working together with neighbors who routinely care for and maintain the traffic island at Klickitat and Alameda, we were able to develop a design for the raingarden at that location.

I. RECOMMENDATION

> Authorize a contract and provide for payment for the construction of the NE Klickitat Neighborhood Greenway Project, BES Project No. E10126 (Ordinance)

11. **BACKGROUND**

> The purpose of this contract will be to construct 26 green street facilities need to be installed to improve stormwater management, pedestrian safety, and bicycle movement. Approximately 750 feet of new combined sewer pipe on NE Klickitat needs to be constructed to provide standard sewer service to existing properties.

> The construction methods will be open cut excavation, curb extensions, and saw cutting. In addition to new green street facilities and sewer mains, this project will also replace manholes, service laterals, stormwater inlets and inlet pipes.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

> Funds are available in the Bureau of Environmental Services Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2012-2013, Project E10126.C60. The level of confidence of the cost estimate is "High".

This project allows BES to continue to operate and maintain the public sewer system. Construction of new green street facilities and sewer mains is consistent with the Bureau of Environmental Services Mission and City Policies:

Protect public health, water quality, and the environment:

Provide sewage and stormwater collection services to accommodate Portland's current and future needs and;

Protect and promote healthy ecosystems in our watershed.
