a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The construction will largely impact traffic on SE Powell Blvd, between SE 121st Ave. and SE 92nd Ave., due to the simultaneous construction of the city's Emergency Coordination Center (ECC) at SE Powell Blvd and SE 99th Ave. Due to the mountain location of the reservoir work, noise levels may be evident but not loud during the work.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on November 22, 2010.

Additional, since summer 2010, PWB Public Outreach staff have consulted with the Lents and Powellhurst-Gilbert neighborhood associations to determine if there were any public concerns about the project. Traffic problems were identified. Staff also addressed questions from area residents at the East Portland Expo in 2010 and 2011.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

PWB Public Outreach staff actively worked with the public and surrounding neighborhoods to explain the need and reasons for the larger Kelly Butte reservoir. Public meetings were held on December 7, 2010 and November 17, 2011, both at the Lents Adventist Church. Presentations were also given frequently to Lents, Powellhurst-Gilbert and Centennial neighborhood associations and the Midway Business Association.

d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item?

Procurement Services advertised the project for proposals and held the pre-proposal meeting that was open to the construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State as minority, women, and emerging small businesses.

Public Outreach plans were developed and implemented by PWB Community Information and Involvement staff Tim Hall and former employee Sarah Bott.

PWB wants to keep the public well informed on its covered reservoir projects. Outreach staff will continue to notify the public and affected neighborhoods on the project's progress via the news media, public open houses, and regularly presentations to the Neighborhood Associations. The bureau will continue to participate with an information booth at community events, such as the East Portland Expo. The bureau will also work with PBOT and community members to ensure the traffic control for SE Powell Blvd ensure public safety. The bureau will also continue to coordinate its construction with that of the new ECC.

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- 7. <u>BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS</u>: Ordinance Number 183913 authorized Procurement Services to use an alternative contracting method to select a Construction Manager/General Contractor, and provided for payment for construction of the Kelly Butte Reservoir Project.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT</u>: The Engineer's estimate for construction costs was \$70,000,000 with a Low Confidence Level Rating. Funding for a portion of this project is included in the Water Bureau FY 2012-13 Budget and additional funding will be requested in the FY 2013-14 through 2015-16 Budgets.
- RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept Guaranteed Maximum Price of \$57,250,000.00 from Hoffman Construction Company of Oregon for the construction of the Kelly Butte Reservoir Project.
- 10. <u>SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT</u>: The project includes all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and supervision necessary to construct a new buried 25 million gallon reinforced concrete reservoir, increasing the storage capacity at Kelly Butte. Further, this project has an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved schedule to comply with the EPA's "Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule to disconnect the City's open reservoirs.
