ORDINANCE No.

*Amend an Intergovernmental Agreement with TriMet and Clackamas County for Transit Police services to comply with contract language requirements specific to federal grant funds (Ordinance; amend Contract No. 30001098)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. The Police Bureau currently manages Tri-County Metropolitan Transportation District (TriMet) Transit Police under Agreement No. 30001665, the "Prime Agreement" between the City and TriMet, executed July 1, 2010, as authorized by Ordinance 184038, and which will expire June 30, 2015.
- 2. The TriMet Transit Police Division includes sworn law-enforcement personnel from the City, City of Beaverton, City of Cornelius, City of Gresham, City of Hillsboro, Port of Portland, City of Tigard, City of Troutdale, City of Milwaukie, City of Tualatin, City of West Linn, City of Forest Grove, City of Lake Oswego, Oregon City, Multnomah County, Washington County and Clackamas County, which are currently provided under subsidiary agreements.
- 3. All contracts that potentially use federal grant funds must contain specific contract language. The City and TriMet wish to amend Agreement No. 30001098 with Clackamas County to bring the agreement into full compliance with these requirements.
- 4. Concurrent with this agreement with Clackamas County, intergovernmental agreements will be amended between the City, TriMet and each of the other jurisdictions that provide transit police services.
- 5. An emergency exists because the current agreement is noncompliant with federal grant funds contract language requirements. All other terms and conditions of the agreements will remain in full force and effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council directs:

a. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to amend an agreement between the City of Portland, TriMet, and Clackamas County substantially in accordance with the agreement attached as Exhibit A.

Section 2. The Council declares an emergency exists because the agreement must be brought into compliance with federal grant funds contract regulations. A delay in proceeding with this agreement will unnecessarily prolong the time in which the City, TriMet, and each of the jurisdictions are noncompliant. Therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council.
