7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

This Ordinance is to settle a bodily injury claim from an automobile collision on May 5, 2011. Ms. Somers was traveling northbound on NE 122nd. Our Portland Fire employee was exiting a driveway on the east side of NE 122nd, attempting a left turn across the northbound lanes, to travel southbound on NE 122nd. Our driver failed to see the claimant in the inside lane, and turned directly in front of her path. Our investigation indicates the City has clear liability for the resulting collision.

Ms. Somers suffered significant injury in the collision. The parties engaged in substantial negotiation regarding settlement of the claim. The initial settlement demand was in excess of \$150,000. Ultimately, the parties have agreed to settle for the total sum of \$85,588.87. The settlement payment will be made in one payment through her attorney's trust account, and from the total settlement the attorney will satisfy claims of medical providers and Ms. Somers' auto insurer, State Farm, which made payments on her behalf for medical costs and wage loss. (Property damage to her vehicle was previously settled by Risk for \$5,000, making the total cost of the settlement \$90,588.87).

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

Approval of the settlement would result in a payment of \$85,588.87 from the liability fund.

9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED

Approve settlement of Myna Somers bodily injury claim in the sum of \$85,588.87.
