7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

Attached is an ordinance to extend termination dates of four mechanical engineering on-call services contracts through September 23, 2013. City of Portland Code 5.33.220.D.10 authorizes the renegotiation of existing contracts with incumbent contractors when it is in the best interests of the City. The Contractors were competitively awarded their current on-call services contracts August 23, 2007. Request for Proposals (BGS025) was issued on July 19, 2007 and eight proposals were received on August 7, 2007. A selection committee recommended all eight firms be awarded contracts in the amount of \$50,000 each.

Amendments to the following contracts are necessary to allow for completion of existing task orders and potential utilization of the balances remaining on the contracts. The contract amounts will remain the same.

Environmental & Engineering Services Inc. - Contract No. 37638

Three task orders have been issued for a total of \$31,730. There is a balance of \$18,270 remaining against the balance of the contract. Task order 3 issued July 9, 2012 allowed for mechanical engineering services for the City Kids Heating & Ventilation project at The Portland Building which is in progress.

HDR Architecture Inc. - Contract No. 30002583

Two task orders have been issued for a total of \$25,000. There is a balance of \$25,000 remaining against the balance of the contract. Task order 2 issued November 23, 2011 allowed for mechanical engineering services to replace air handling units at Union Station which is in progress.

R&W Engineering Inc. - Contract No. 37636

Four task orders have been issued for a total of \$28,759. There is a balance of \$21,241 remaining against the balance of the contract. Task order 4 issued June 11, 2012 allowed for mechanical engineering services for the City Hall DDC system upgrade project which is in progress.

System Design Consultants Inc. – Contract No. 37711

Two task orders have been issued for a total of \$31,600. There is a balance of \$18,400 remaining against the balance of the contract. Task order 2 issued June 4, 2012 allowed for mechanical engineering services at The Portland Building for the louver and valve replacement and DDC conversion project which is in progress.

The cost of the work is budgeted in various CIP and maintenance projects planned by Facilities Services. The project budgets are covered by the major maintenance reserves in the Facilities Services fund, building rental rates, or are pass through expenses billed to other bureaus.
