a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The purpose of this legislation is to amend the Resolution 36959 a resolution that called for additional federal reviews pertaining to the shipping of coal by rail. The perceived impacts are depicted in the original resolution. This resolution simply corrects an oversight in the Be It Further Resolved section of that resolution.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

A council hearing was held on September 19, 2012 with over 150 members of the public present. Many groups and individuals—through written and oral testimony on both sides of the issue—provided background information and suggestions. Some of the groups that testified included Neighborhood Associations, Friends of the Columbia River Gorge, Power Past Coal, the Sierra Club, Physicians for Social Responsibility and others. Draft legislation (which had this proposed amendment in it) was sent to a list of interested parties in advance and comments solicited; several public comments were incorporated into the final document.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

Community interest and advocacy led to the creation of the original Resolution 36959. This draft legislation was sent to a list of interested parties in advance of that hearing and comments were solicited; several comments were incorporated into the final document in the findings but just not in the Be It Further Resolved section which is what this resolution will accomplish.

Commissioner Fritz and staff designed and implemented the public involvement.
