Yes. There is not enough known at present to engage the public, because the design phase has not begun.

We anticipate impacts on the community may focus on noise, vibration, odors, traffic congestion, loss of parking spaces, and the aesthetics of the structures.

During the design phase for these projects outreach staff and project team members will work with the adjacent property owners (Safeway Stores Incorporated and The Grotto) as well as area neighborhood associations (Hayden Island Neighborhood Network, Madison South, Sumner and Maywood Park), and local neighbors and property owners. The goal of this interaction will be to produce a design that meets the project goals, has input and review from neighbors, and meets community needs.

#### I. RECOMMENDATION

Amend contract with BergerABAM for additional work and compensation for the Skidmore and Safeway Pump Station Remodels, Project Nos. E10291 and E10292

POTENTIAL FUTURE CONTRACT AMENDMENTS: The negotiated scope and fee for the recommended contract does not anticipate the need for future contract amendments. However, it is possible that an unanticipated change in the required scope of work could occur for the following types of events that have occurred in the past on other wastewater pump station remodel/upgrade projects:

- Physical conditions can be discovered during the detailed field investigations of the pump station facility that may require more extensive upgrade or replacement of the structure to meet current code.
- A change in the required pumping capacity of future operational goals for the facility based on revisions or modifications to the overall sewer conveyance system due to ongoing analysis and system modeling by the BES Asset Systems Management.
- Resolution of constructability issues and coordination with the BES Construction Services Division during design development may require more effort than originally anticipated.
- Property or easement acquisition efforts may require unanticipated design revisions.
- The City may adopt a new policy, or modify the scope or application of any existing policy that could impact the scope of design required for the pump station facility.
- Project priorities for the overall sewer conveyance system might change that could require either acceleration or deferral of the project that could impact the consultant's level of effort.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Remodeling of the Skidmore and Safeway Wastewater Pump Stations has been undertaken as part of the Pump Station Improvement Program. Remodeling will reduce maintenance requirements and improve the reliability of these stations

This ordinance provides for additional work necessary to address odor treatment design for both stations, and to design structures at the Safeway pump station to accommodate the capacity required for future development.

### III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The estimated cost of this contract amendment is \$97,413. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2012 Budget, Bureau of Environmental Services, Project Nos. E10291 and E10292.
