The purpose of this amendment is to add contractual spending authority of \$500,000 to the existing contract while PBOT solicits for a new flexible services contract. Extend contract termination to be June 30, 2013 for the same reason. Current authorization will expire before the new contract is in place.

This is a personnel services contract where the need is determined by available resources and the estimate is based on current expenditure levels. Reimbursement comes from each individual externally funded project. The original contract was \$500,000 over a 3-year period. A heavier use of temporary employees exhausted the authorization amount in the first year requiring a 25% increase of \$125,000. During the second year of the contract, the Federal ARRA projects arrived requiring additional staffing and a contract increase of \$1 million. The ARRA projects expired the contract authorization and an amendment of \$500,000 was approved to finish out the 3-year 2008-2011 contract. A new solicitation process recently concluded in September of 2012 but was unsuccessful in awarding a new contract. This legislation will extend the existing contract to allow PBOT to authorize a new solicitation.
