The original cost of Contract No. 30002064, with Moore Excavation, Inc. was \$3,825,432. Change Order No. 1 added \$936,342.62. Change Order No. 2 added 132 days of contract time at no additional cost. This Change Order No. 3 will increase the contract by \$1,083,050. The new

contract amount will be \$5,844,824.62. Funding will be requested in the FY 2012-13 Fall BuMP. All work will be completed in FY 2012-13.

All work was completed in the public right-of-way. The community impacted by this work was notified by the Water Bureau Public Community Involvement & Information Manager using a variety of measures to minimize the impact on the community. These included:

- Water Bureau's Public Community Involvement & Information Manager distributed informational door hangers to residents and businesses within the construction zone, held public information meetings, responded to complaints from businesses and residents regarding the construction work.
- Traffic advisories were distributed to the media and neighborhood groups advising the public in advance of upcoming work.
- Traffic plans were reviewed and approved by the City Traffic Engineers with consideration to keep automotive, pedestrian, and bicycle traffic moving as efficiently and safely as possible.
- Portable changeable message boards were posted throughout the project with updated information of impacts to the public.
- Flaggers were utilized to facilitate safe access and passage for the public as well as to protect the workers.
