7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

The purpose of this legislation is to ratify a Letter of Agreement (LOA) between the City on behalf of the Office of Neighborhood Involvement and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, Local 189 (AFSCME, Local 189) authorizing limits on compensatory time pay-outs for employees in the Crime Prevention Program Administrator classification. The DCTU Collective Bargaining Agreement allows employees to cash out accrued compensatory time up to twice per year. ONI has expended 106% of the Crime Prevention Program's 2012-13 overtime/compensatory time budget. The LOA prevents Crime Prevention Program Administrators working at ONI from cashing out accrued compensatory time during the rest of fiscal year 2012-13. This LOA ends on June 30, 2012.
