7. BACKGROUND / ANALYSIS

Since 2004, the City Council has granted several wireless right-of-way agreements. The general approach has been to have these agreements effective for a short term to allow the City to develop consistently applicable terms and conditions. City staff has now reviewed all of these wireless right-of-way agreements, and worked with citizens (see Section VI below), the wireless industry, and the utility pole owners, in an effort to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of all wireless right-of-way agreements. The City of Portland granted a temporary right-of-way agreement on June 27, 2012 to allow the company to continue to operate in the public right-of-way while the City proceeded with formal City Charter requirements, including publication of the ordinance. The ordinance was published in the Daily Journal of Commerce on July 6, 2012, and a notice published the Oregonian on July 6, 2012. The Bureau requests the first reading for this ordinance to be on November 7, 2012, and the second reading to be on December 12, 2012. Under this schedule, the effective date will be February 10, 2013.

8. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The city will continue to receive franchise fees from this wireless carrier's use of the streets. There will be an increase to \$7,500 per year per wireless site in the right-of-way. As T-Mobile West Corporation currently uses 22 poles, its fees will increase to \$165,000 per year. In addition, when carriers use poles in residential areas they will now need to provide a one-time fee per application to Community Technology, Revenue Bureau in the sum of \$2,000 to cover increased staff costs. This revenue is intended for the general fund and is not new revenue.

> BACKGROUND. Since 2004, the City Council has granted several wireless right-of-way agreements. The general approach has been to have these agreements effective for a short term to allow the City to develop consistently applicable terms and conditions. City staff has now reviewed all of these wireless right-of-way agreements, and worked with citizens (see Section VI below), the wireless industry, and the utility pole owners, in an effort to standardize and modernize the terms and conditions of all wireless right-of-way agreements. - II. FINANCIAL IMPACT. The city will continue to receive franchise fees from this wireless carrier's use of the streets. There will be an increase to \$7,500 per year per wireless site in the right-of-way. As T-Mobile West Corporation currently uses 22 poles, its fees will increase to \$165,000 per year. In addition, when carriers use poles in residential areas they will now need to provide a one-time fee per application to Community Technology, Revenue Bureau in the sum of \$2,000 to cover increased staff costs. This revenue is intended for the general fund and is not new revenue.

- IV. CONTROVERSIAL ISSUES. The agreement addresses the need to provide a better balance between the need for maintaining the character of residential neighborhoods against the need to increase antennas in those areas to increase the provision of wireless services. Compensation for street use is being raised, but industry has been consulted and a special meeting held with them to discuss it. Because wireless is a rapidly growing area the agreement is for another three years, after which another evaluation of terms, including compensation, can occur.
