#### 8. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS

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Introduction and History – City Council is being asked to approve a Resolution which authorizes the Portland Development Commission to serve as the City's designated lead agency for all locally controlled decisions regarding the Federal Immigrant Investor Program, known as EB-5 (Employment Based Immigration: Fifth Preference). This includes program activities and related investments.

Created by Congress in 1990, the EB-5 program makes lawful permanent residence available to qualified foreign nationals on the basis of their creation of new, permanent jobs through capital investments that benefit the U.S. economy. The EB-5 program is a key opportunity to attract investment that advances objectives in the City's 2009 economic development strategy.

While the EB-5 program is administered by the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services in the Department of Homeland Security, a variety of services and endorsements are sought from local municipalities. This support increases confidence of foreign investors who often times are not deeply familiar with the geographic location of their investment. This usually comes in the form of some type of documentation from a local elected official, such as the Mayor.

This Council action will formally direct all requests and processing to PDC. By designating PDC as the city's lead agency, Portland will have a streamlined, efficient and coordinated approach to EB-5 investments.

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This action aligns with PDC's existing services and responsibilities in a number of ways, including:

- Ongoing involvement with the program locally, such as managing a solicitation of interest in 2010 regarding the formation of EB-5 Regional Centers;
- Data-oriented assistance for Targeted Employment Areas;
- Hosting investor groups and delegations of foreign nationals, facilitating investment opportunities, and acting as the information source for all EB-5-related activities; and
- The ability to combine other economic development tools, including loan products, E-Zone and tax increment financing – in addition to convening traded sector and cluster industry partners – to facilitate successful EB-5 projects.

PDC's involvement will afford a range of essential services that create a predictable investment environment to encourage consistent deal flow and foreign direct investment capital into local projects and firms.

Legal Issues - None. PDC is permitted to be assigned this role. It is not requesting a role which competes with any other local or state request.

Link to Current City Policies – 2009 Economic Development Strategy

**Controversial Issues** – Minimal. This assignment of responsibility reflects the public sector adds value to support which is essential to the private sector. PDC will likely seek compensation for work performed. While this is standard practice in cities such as Philadelphia, it will be new for Portland.

Citizen Participation - None; this is an administrative action.

**Other Government Participation** – None (see reference to State above)

#### 9. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Resolution does not have any financial impact on the City or PDC.

## **10. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED**
