a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item? None. This project design was reviewed through a Type III Design Review (12-112033) with public hearings before the Design Commission. The Design Commission unanimously approved this project August 2, 2012.
b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved? The Pearl District Neighborhood Association, Pearl District Business Association, and Neighbors West/Northwest were notified on June 19, 2012 of the first Design Commission public hearing on July 12, 2102. No opposition testimony was heard at that hearing or the final Design Commission hearing on August 2, 2192.

- c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item? The design of the building was shaped by input and advice from public testimony and from the Design Commissioners during the public review of this project to better meet all applicable design guidelines.
- d) Who designed and implemented the public involvement related to this Council item? The public involvement is determined by Title 33 requirements for a public hearing before the Design Commission, and the policies of the City's Encroachments in the Public Right-of-Way. Bureau of Transportation staff also provided a 30 day public review of the projections over the right-of-way to all public and private utility entities on November 1, 2012. Bureau of Transporation received no objections from any of the notified parties.
