Authorize an Intergovernmental Agreement with Portland State University to examine the safety climate and work/family stress-related causes of accidents among Water Bureau employees (Ordinance)

2) Purpose of the Proposed Legislation: The purpose is to authorize a new Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Portland State University (PSU) in order to examine the safety climate and work/family stress-related causes of accidents among Water Bureau employees.

The Water Bureau previously entered into an IGA with PSU to conduct a study of the safety climate to focus on work-family conflict with the goal of mitigating barriers, improving safety behavior, and to better understand the safety behavior relating to these components. The project has been expanded to include a partnership with Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU), the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) and the Portland Department of Transportation Maintenance Division.
