Requested Council Hearing Date:

I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize updated Intergovernmental Agreement with the Port of Portland to provide cost sharing on National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Discharge permit compliance actions.

II. **BACKGROUND**

The City of Portland and its co-permittee the Port of Portland (Port), received their renewed NPDES MS4 permit on January 31, 2011. The co-permittees have agreed to establish implementation responsibilities and to cost share on a variety of permit compliance actions. The City and Port last entered into a cost sharing IGA in 2007 that provided for the Port to reimburse the City for monitoring, reporting, and other compliance activities. Since the 2007 agreement was authorized, permit conditions were enacted and monitoring and permit implementation costs have increased. This agreement replaces the existing IGA and establishes updated responsibilities and cost sharing.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Port will reimburse the City approximately \$42,000 annually. The IGA provides for increasing this amount in response to increases in City costs. The IGA includes provision for the City to cost share with the Port on professional technical services that mutually benefit both co-permittees. The City's cost will be determined in accordance with the provisions of section 5 of the IGA. The 2007 IGA included a similar provision for City cost sharing. Over a five-year period The City's costs were approximately \$60,000.
