 - a) What impacts are anticipated in the community from this proposed Council item?

The adjacent property owners will be impacted since the new road segment will require right of way acquisition. The larger community will benefit from the reconfigured intersection that will improve sight lines for vehicles turning from SW Stephenson Street.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

Involved parties include the Arnold Creek Neighborhood Association, Southwest Neighborhoods, Inc. (SWNI), adjacent property owners, and community at large. These groups were represented on the Stakeholder Advisory Committee (SAC) for the project. The Arnold Creek Neighborhood Association also held a public meeting for Arnold Creek Residents to learn about the project and vote on whether to construct this new intersection. Information about the project was also mailed to 1400+ residents. Residents were directed to an online survey to read about and weigh in on the project.

c) How did public involvement shape the outcome of this Council item?

We received overwhelming support for the project from the community. Many feel that the intersection is unsafe and needs to be redesigned. At the neighborhood meeting, 99 residents attended and voted on whether to move forward with the project. Voting results: 92 in support, 6 against, and 1 undecided.
