7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The Bureau of Planning and Sustainability has a need for recycling, composting, and garbage hauling services on a regular basis for City bureaus at various locations throughout the City. With the passage of Ordinance 185643, the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability received Council authorization to use a competitive request for proposals (RFP)

The Chief Procurement Officer advertised RFP No. 114864, issued on October 2, 2012, for Recycling, Composting, and Garbage Hauling Services and three (3) proposals were received. The proposals were reviewed, evaluated, and scored by the evaluation committee, which included minority evaluator participation, in accordance with Portland City Code 5.33. The proposal from Trashco Services, Inc. was deemed responsive to the requirements of the solicitation, and received the highest evaluation score. The City issued a Notice of Intent to Negotiate and Award a price agreement to Trashco Services, Inc., on November 20, 2012 and no protests were received.

Trashco Services, Inc., has a current City of Portland business license, is in full compliance with the Equal Benefits Program, and their EEO Certification is current through December 2, 2013. Trashco Services, Inc., is a local firm located in Portland, Oregon, and is not a State Certified MWESB contractor. The Bureau's level of confidence in the cost estimates for this project is High as there very good historical information showing purchases made for these types of services

Awarding a price agreement to Trashco Services, Inc., will allow the Bureau of Planning and Sustainability to continue its efficient and cost effective process of analyzing and consolidating recycling, composting, and garbage hauling services
