There will be disruption to residents, businesses and traffic.

Construction impacts will include: Noise, vibration and dust at eight work sites and odor from cured-in-place plastic liner. Due to the proximity Vernon School, all construction work along NE 22nd Avenue between NE Sumner Street and NE Emerson, NE 23rd Avenue between NE Killingsworth Street and NE Sumner, and NE Killingsworth Street between NE 24th Avenue and NE 25th Avenue will be done after June 13 when public schools are out of session and prior to schools start day in September.

b) Which community and business groups, under-represented groups, organizations, external government entities, and other interested parties were involved in this effort, and when and how were they involved?

The construction contracting community, including contractors certified with the State of Oregon as minority, women, and emerging small businesses. They became involved when the project advertised for bids on September 26, 2012.

- 7. BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS: Ordinance Number 185469 authorized a contract and provided for payment for the Vernon-Sabin-Alameda Sewer Rehabilitation Phase 1. The project involves approximately 11,000 feet of combined sewer pipe in NE Portland from NE Killingsworth Street to NE Alameda Street between NE 16th Avenue and NE 33rd Avenue that are in a seriously deteriorated condition and need to be replaced or repaired.
- 8. <u>FINANCIAL IMPACT:</u> The engineer's estimate for this project was \$3,220,000.00 and the confidence level was Optimal. Funding for this project is available in the Sewer Operating Fund FY 12/13 Budget under WBS Element E10184.C60.
- 9. RECOMMENDATION/ACTION REQUESTED: Accept recommendation to award the contract to Tapani Underground, Inc. in the amount of \$2,838,596.00.
- 10. SCOPE OF WORK ON PROJECT: The purpose of this project will be to construct approximately 11,000 feet of 8 inch to 12 inch combined sewer pipe in NE Portland. The existing sewers are seriously deteriorated and their failure will compromise the health and safety of the residents. There are about 24 party sewer properties within the project site which will receive separate service laterals as part of this project.

This project is one of the BES Maintenance and Reliability "Structural Rehabilitation of Combined and Sanitary Sewer." The construction method will be open cut excavation and cured in place lining (CIPP). In addition to replacing the sewer mains, this project will also replace manholes, service laterals, stormwater inlets and inlet pipe.

ORDINANCE No. 185469

Authorize a contract and provide for payment for the construction of the Vernon-Sabin-Alameda Phase 1 Sewer Rehabilitation Project No. E10184 (Ordinance)

The City of Portland ordains:

Section 1. The Council finds:

- 1. Approximately 11,000 feet of combined sewer pipe in NE Portland from NE Killingsworth St to NE Alameda St between NE 16th Ave and NE 33rd Ave are in a seriously deteriorated condition and need to be repaired or replaced.
- 2. Environmental Services has prepared plans and specifications for rehabilitating the deteriorated sewer pipe including manholes, service laterals, stormwater inlets and inlet pipe.
- 3. Environmental Services requires the furnishing of labor and materials to construct this project.
- 4. The estimated cost is \$3,220,000 with an optimal level of confidence. Funds are available in the Sewer System Operating Fund, FY 2012-2013, Bureau of Environmental Services, WBS E10184.C60.

NOW, THEREFORE, the council directs:

- a. The Commissioner of Public Affairs is authorized to execute a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the purpose described in Section 1.
- b. The Mayor and Auditor are hereby authorized to draw and deliver warrants chargeable to the Sewer System Operating Fund Budget when demand is presented and approved by the proper authority.
