I. RECOMMENDATION

Authorize contract with GSI Water Solutions, Inc. to provide professional and technical services for Underground Injection Control (UIC) and National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) Program implementation to ensure compliance with the City's Oregon Department of Environmental Quality issued permits.

II. BACKGROUND

The federal Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) of 1974 provides a comprehensive national framework to ensure the quality and safety of drinking water supplies. The Underground Injection Control (UIC) program under the SDWA protects underground sources of drinking water by regulating various classes of underground injection. BES uses UICs (drywells) to infiltrate stormwater runoff from public roads. The City currently operates approximately 9,000 public UIC systems under a Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) Permit issued by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in 2005. The WPCF permit establishes numerical limits for stormwater discharges to UICs and the construction, operation and maintenance requirements the City must implement to comply with the federal SDWA and Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) for UICs (OAR 340-044) and groundwater protection (OAR 340-040).

The City holds a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) Discharge permit issued by DEQ in accordance with the requirements of the federal Clean Water Act. The five-year permit, reissued in 2011, requires the reduction of pollutants in stormwater discharges from the MS4 to the "maximum extent practicable" and includes specific pollution prevention and stormwater management programmatic requirements. The permit also requires extensive programmatic technical evaluations that include assessing

progress towards pollutant load reduction benchmarks, conducting an assessment of hydromodification impacts from MS4 discharges and developing a retrofit plan to address the impacts from stormwater runoff from existing development.

Under this legislation, BES, with the assistance of GSI Water Solutions, Inc. through mutually signed task orders, will perform work that meets permit established requirements and schedules. Task orders will be developed by BES and issued based on project needs.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT

The contract will provide funding for professional and technical services not to exceed \$500,000 over the next three years.

BES uses UICs (drywells) to infiltrate stormwater runoff from public roads. The City currently operates approximately 9,000 public UIC systems under a Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF) Permit issued by the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) in 2005. The WPCF permit establishes numerical limits for stormwater discharges to UICs and the construction, operation and maintenance requirements the City must implement to comply with the federal SDWA and Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) for UICs (OAR 340-044) and groundwater protection (OAR 340-040).

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer (MS4) Discharge permit establishes controls and limitations for stormwater discharges from the MS4 to receiving waters. The City's stormwater permit area includes sections of the City within the urban services boundary that drain to a separate storm sewer system.

The MS4 permit, reissued in January 2011, satisfies the requirements of the federal Clean Water Act (as amended in 1987 to regulate pollution in stormwater runoff from urban areas), as defined in Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 122.26 and 122.42. The 2011 permit requires programmatic technical evaluations that include assessing progress towards pollutant load reduction benchmarks, conducting an assessment of hydromodification impacts from MS4 discharges and developing a retrofit plan to address the impacts from stormwater runoff from existing development
